DISEASE PREVENTION & TREATMENT



We believe good health care is everyone's right. Yet 400 million people in the world can't afford or don't have access to basic health care.

Disease results in misery, pain, and poverty for millions of people worldwide. That's why treating and preventing disease is so important to us. We lead efforts both large and small. We set up temporary clinics, blood donation centers, and training facilities in underserved communities struggling with outbreaks and health care access. We design and build infrastructure that allows doctors, patients, and governments to work together.

Our members combat diseases like malaria, HIV/AIDS, Alzheimer's, multiple sclerosis, diabetes, and polio. Prevention is important, which is why we also focus on health education and bringing people routine hearing, vision, and dental care.

DISEASE PREVENTION & TREATMENT

Rotary December Theme: Disease Prevention and Treatment

Every December, Rotary International focuses on **Disease Prevention and Treatment**, highlighting its commitment to building healthier communities worldwide. This theme emphasizes Rotary's role in addressing one of humanity's most pressing challenges: ensuring access to healthcare, improving preventive measures, and providing effective treatments.

The Global Burden of Disease

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), millions of lives are lost every year to preventable diseases such as malaria, tuberculosis, and HIV/AIDS. Additionally, chronic diseases like diabetes, cancer, and cardiovascular conditions continue to rise, particularly in underserved regions. Rotary clubs worldwide are stepping in to close gaps in healthcare access, deliver essential medical supplies, and support long-term initiatives to combat these health crises.

Rotary's Key Initiatives in Health

Rotary's disease prevention and treatment programs are diverse and impactful. Here are some of the cornerstone efforts:

- 1. Polio Eradication Rotary's flagship initiative, PolioPlus, has made incredible strides in eradicating polio. Since 1988, the program has reduced polio cases by 99.9%, providing vaccinations to billions of children and creating a robust network for disease surveillance.
- 2. Access to Healthcare Many Rotary clubs fund and build health facilities in remote and impoverished areas. Mobile clinics, medical camps, and telemedicine programs ensure that even the most isolated communities receive timely care.
- 3. **Preventive Measures** Prevention is at the heart of Rotary's health initiatives. Clubs organize vaccination drives, distribute mosquito nets to combat malaria, and promote education about hygiene and sanitation to curb communicable diseases.
- 4. Training Healthcare Workers A skilled workforce is essential to an effective healthcare system. Rotary provides scholarships, training workshops, and resources to medical professionals to enhance their capabilities.
- 5. Chronic Disease Management Rotary projects focus on raising awareness and offering treatment options for conditions like diabetes and cancer. By partnering with hospitals and NGOs, Rotary clubs provide early detection services, patient counseling, and subsidized treatment plans.

Presidential Peace Conference

PRESIDENTIAL MESSAGE

To adapt, as laid out in Rotary's Action Plan, we must occasionally step out of our comfort zone and try something new. Here are two examples of clubs that adapted — one with heart and one through critical thinking and strategy.

The Rotary Club of Chandigarh Mid Town, India, led with heart earlier this year. To engage members and grow membership, Club President Nitin Kapur personally called every former member of the club and invited them to a gathering billed as an alumni meetup.

Eight former members attended, and the results were stupendous. The visitors had a chance to connect once more — not only with current members but with the sense of camaraderie and belonging that membership gave them. By the end of the evening, the club welcomed six of the former members back into the Rotary family.

Club President Kapur showed courage when he reached out to the alumni. Not only did he adapt and try something new but he had the strength of character to show the club's alumni how much they still meant to the family of Rotary. That bravery paid off.

People want to feel needed and appreciated. People want to feel that they belong. And they might never feel that way if we don't have the courage to tell them.

Meanwhile, the Rotary Club of Seoul-Hansoo, Korea, has been experimenting with different club models to great effect. Over the past four years, Seoul-Hansoo has created and maintained four satellite clubs — a service club, an interest-based club for musicians, a cause-based club that mentors professionals, and a club for college students.

These satellite clubs are part of a five-year plan the Seoul-Hansoo club implemented to increase membership through innovation.

What's the secret to founding and maintaining so many satellite clubs? Membership between Seoul-Hansoo and its satellite clubs is fluid and synergistic. Many members of the satellite clubs attend the sponsor club's meetings. And many of the sponsor club's members participate in the satellite clubs.

PRESIDENTIAL MESSAGE

Additionally, the focus of each satellite club is no accident. Each one appeals to different interests of people in the sponsor club and in the community, attracting existing and potential members. This is an excellent strategy to both retain and attract members because it offers flexibility. If someone is interested in joining but they can't make it to the sponsor club's meetings, they have plenty of options to choose from.

These are just two examples of how we can adapt with our hearts and minds. Every club is different, so I encourage you to reach out to members of your club and of the community around you. Ask them about the club experience and what you can do to improve.

Talk to enough people and you might find ways that you can adapt and spark The Magic of Rotary in your club.

The Rotary Bell: A Tradition Forged in Friendship

Have you ever wondered why Rotary presidents open and close meetings by ringing the iconic Rotary bell? Let's journey back in time to uncover the legendary story behind this cherished tradition—a tale born from camaraderie, competition, and a spirit of unity.

In the early 1920s, a friendly rivalry unfolded between the Rotary Club of New York and the Rotary Club of London. The challenge? To see which club could host the most visiting Rotarians in a single Rotary calendar year. When the dust settled, the Rotary Club of New York emerged victorious, earning a truly remarkable prize: the "Attention Bell."

This bell wasn't just any bell—it hailed from the British auxiliary warship Patrol No. 20 and was mounted on oak timber taken from Admiral Nelson's legendary flagship, Victory. In 1922, the president of the Rotary Club of New York, Robert L. Hatch, proudly rang this prized bell to open and close a meeting, inadvertently establishing a tradition that continues to this day.

Although the original bell was tragically stolen during a fire in the Colonial Room at the Roosevelt Hotel, New York City, in 1978, the spirit of the tradition endured. In 1992, a new bell, equally steeped in history, was gifted to the club by the Rotary Club of London. This replacement bell, from the British submarine chaser H.M.S. P20, was presented by Ken Standish, then-president of the London Club, on June 17, 1992.

Interestingly, Rotary by-laws do not mandate the ringing of a bell to start or close meetings, yet this tradition has become a hallmark of Rotary culture—a powerful symbol of unity, continuity, and shared purpose.

Who could have imagined that a friendly competition nearly a century ago would spark a tradition that continues to inspire Rotarians around the world? This story reminds us that our actions, however small or grand, can resonate far beyond the moment, leaving a legacy for generations to come.

As Rotarians, may we always be mindful of how we treat one another and our communities, knowing that even the simplest gestures can echo through time.




FUND-RAISING FOR UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS,RC OF ADANA KOZA,D.2430

My Mastic Tree Çeşme" Project is an afforestation project that aims to bring the Mastic Trees, which are on the verge of extinction, back to the soil in Çeşme District and is supported by Çeşme District Governorship, Çeşme Municipality, Çeşme Hoteliers Association, Alaçatı Tourism Association, Çeşme Chamber of Tradesmen and Çeşme Peninsula Environment Association.

With the tree planting ceremony held on December 22, it is planned to plant 20,000 Mastic Trees by the end of 2025 and 100,000 in five years in the green areas belonging to Çeşme Municipality and Gum Afforestation Areas belonging to the National Real Estate Directorate with the donations of volunteers and environmentalists.

Within the scope of this project, which seriously supports women's employment and creates 12 months of employment, an exemplary business model is emerging regarding the "home employment" of our women living in Çeşme for the cleaning of the harvested Gum Mastics.

Within the scope of the "101 Mastic Tree Planting Project in the 101st Year of Our Republic" jointly organized by Rotary International District 2440, Rotary Club of Terra Madre and Rotary Club of Çeşme, a "Rotary District 2440 Region Introduction Sign" will be placed in the area where the trees will be planted and the names of each donor will be hung on the trees one by one with tree signs.

After the visit, a lunch followed in a local restaurant.









After a relevant survey on the level of visitor numbers and the needs of each institution, one to three wheelchairs will be donated to these sites to meet their needs.

The wheelchairs offered by Rotary Clubs are of a special type, certified and with the latest safety standards. Also, in some cases, they satisfy the special building needs and standards set by certain Museums.

- Business Open Days: Club members can organize visits to their workplaces or organizations to showcase their professional skills and activities. Invite schoolchildren or students to explore specific professions on-site and share case studies and examples from your practice.
- Professional Support for the Community: Club members can provide free professional services to individuals in need, such as legal advice, financial literacy education, or health consultations.
 Organize a consultation day with pre-registration to ensure a smooth and efficient process.
- Professional Workshops for Children and Youth: Focus on professions that interest young people, such as programming, design, medicine, or engineering. Conduct hands-on workshops, demonstration simulations, and practical problem-solving activities to engage and inspire them.
- Professional Meetings with Inspiring Personalities: Invite local or national leaders to share their professional journeys in an informal setting. They can discuss the challenges they have faced and how they overcame them, offering inspiration and valuable insights.

All of these projects can be implemented with a minimal budget and have a long-lasting positive effect on the community, as well as on the public image of the club.

Once again, I announce the theme of February: Peace, Conflict Prevention and Resolution. One of the most significant international events in February is the Istanbul Peace Conference (February 20-22, 2025), which will be held under the patronage of Stephanie Urchick, President of Rotary International. https://www.rotary.org/en/2025-rotary-presidential-peace-conference
Don't forget to register to celebrate with friends from all over the world the 120th anniversary of the founding of our organization - Rotary International.

I conclude with one final wish for everyone:

With this initiative IAC Plovdiv - Philippopol shows how young people can be an engine of positive change in society.



SABO NIKOLOV: THE BULGARIAN WHO ACHIEVED THE AMERICAN DREAM



At the American Center of the Sofia City Library, a biographical book about the first Bulgarian Rotarian, Sabo Nikolov, was presented. The book was written by the historian of Rotary International District 2482 – Bulgaria, Tsvyatko Kadijski.

The book was published on the initiative of the Rotary Club of Panagyurishte, Nikolov's hometown, with the active participation of the club's president, Stoyan Hristov.

Bulgarian Rotarians gratefully welcomed the hosting of the event by the American Center in Sofia, which enabled the large audience to learn about the life and work of this extraordinary individual and his contribution to development.

At the beginning of the evening, Stoyan briefly shared how the idea of writing a book about this remarkable son of Panagyurishte came about. Following this, Tsvyatko introduced the audience to many new details, previously unknown to the Bulgarian public, about the story of this semi-literate orphaned farmhand who left for America at the age of 16.

Through hard work, Sabo Nikolov earned an education at the Worcester Polytechnic Institute. In the Institute's Yearbook for the Class of 1896, it is written: "He is the only Bulgarian we know. But if all his compatriots are like him, then Bulgarians are very good people." He gained practical experience at Norton Company and rose to the position of senior partner and vice president of the renowned engineering company Leland-Gifford. He invented an exceptionally precise method for grinding machine parts.

In 1917, he patented a belt for power transmission in metal-cutting machines, which today is of great interest to collectors. A respected citizen, enterprising industrialist, philanthropist, and benefactor for numerous public causes in Worcester and Putnam, he lived there until the end of his life. For his donation of over \$100,000 to Worcester Polytechnic Institute, he was honored with the title of "Founder-President." He was regularly elected as a trustee of the Worcester Academy of Mathematics and Science. For the Worcester Trade School, he established the annual "Sabo Nikolov Award."

SABO NIKOLOV: THE BULGARIAN WHO ACHIEVED THE AMERICAN DREAM

Sabo Nikolov was the initiator and donor behind the construction of the airport, the radio station, and the nurses' home in Putnam. He also donated a plot of land for the construction of the city's water reservoir. Nikolov was a member of the Putnam Chamber of Commerce. For us Bulgarians, it is heartwarming to learn from the records of the Chamber's re-election board on May 26, 1926, that the participants were captivated by a Bulgarian folk song performed by Sabo Nikolov himself.

What could Sabo have been thinking as he sang that night? Could the semi-literate orphan who once herded flocks near Karaglar, chopped wood for Pastor Marsh in Plovdiv, cared for Pastor Sleeper's luggage on his journey to America, worked for meager pay just to learn a trade, took out loans, and sold books to complete his higher education, have ever imagined that he would one day stand as an equal before the elite of Massachusetts and be invited to sing a song from his small, impoverished Balkan homeland?



What was Sabo thinking when he sang her that night? Was it the semi-literate orphan who had herded near Karaglar, chopped wood for Pastor Marsh in Plovdiv, cared for Pastor Slipper's luggage on the way to America, worked for a pittance, only to learn a trade, took out loans and sold books to get a college degree ever imagined that he would stand before the Massachusetts elite as an equal and be invited to sing them a song from the poor little Balkan country?

He married Grace Durfee, by father a direct descendant of the pilgrim Thomas Durfee, who arrived in 1620 in New England on the ship Mayflower It is a great honor for Szabo that, as part of the family, his name appears in a seminal reference work in U.S. history, the "Index to Mayflower Descendants" (the only English name in there!).

A great lover of motoring, the ingenious American inventor and designer "Uncle Henry" (Henry Leland, with whom he had a close business and personal relationship) specially designed a custom Cadillac for him. Among the many innovations are folding seats that can turn a coupe into a bedroom - something that didn't appear in mass production until several decades later. A new, previously unknown aspect of Szabo's life is his passion for travelling.

He is a tireless traveller - he has toured the Pacific coast of the USA, Canada and Mexico, the Caribbean, South America, the Mediterranean, on expeditions to Greenland, Spitsbergen, Iceland. His film about Lapland was a great success in the USA.

SABO NIKOLOV: THE BULGARIAN WHO ACHIEVED THE AMERICAN DREAM

The book also includes the Rotary history of Sabo Nikolov. He was the first Bulgarian Rotarian (admitted to the Worcester Rotary Club, USA, in 1915). As the president of the Putnam Rotary Club (where he moved in 1923), he represented the club at the 25th Jubilee Convention of Rotary International in Chicago in 1930. He worked tirelessly to promote and develop Rotary in Bulgaria and to represent the country in the global Rotary community.

Sabo Nikolov passed away in 1957 in the USA and was buried in the family tomb of the Durfee family in Putnam.

The reader also learns about his contributions to Bulgaria's development. He financially supported Bulgarian students in the USA, Germany, and France. Among them was the remarkable Bulgarian scientist, public figure, and Rotarian Dimitar Atanasov, the last president of the Sofia Rotary Club before its ban in 1941. Through his donation, the Phytopathological Laboratory and the Vegetation House at the Agronomy Faculty were built. His funds also enabled the construction of the surgical department building and equipped the gynecology unit at the hospital in his hometown of Panagyurishte. The disinfection machine he donated was used until 1979! In his will, he established a fund that is still used today to support the hospital's activities.






In his presentation, Tsvyatko noted that through numerous exhibitions, lectures, and books, Bulgarian Rotarians remind the current generation of this extraordinary individual. One of the highlights is the monument to Sabo Nikolov, erected in 2005 by the Rotary Club in Panagyurishte.

It is also worth mentioning that in 2023, the historian of Rotary-Bulgaria donated his entire collection, "Rotary in Bulgaria 1933-1941," to the Sofia History Museum. This collection includes all artifacts and documents related to Nikolov preserved in Bulgaria, including a magnificent portrait of him painted by Konstantin Shturkelov. The newly published book Sabo Nikolov is yet another contribution to immortalizing the memory of the first Bulgarian Rotarian.

Three days before the book's presentation, a 30-minute radio program aired on Radio Sofia featuring a conversation between Tsvyatko Kadijski and host Lili Goleminova. Evidently, the story of Rotarian Nikolov sparked great interest, as Goleminova later shared: "The article was the most-read piece on our website for three days!" At the request of the U.S. Embassy's Cultural Attaché, Mr. Eric Brazil, information about Sabo Nikolov and the book's presentation at the American Center was prepared and sent for publication on the Embassy's website.

A WELL-DESERVED, THOUGH BELATED, RECOGNITION

On the occasion of the 130th anniversary of the birth of Prof. Dimitar Atanasov – scientist, public figure, and Rotarian – and in connection with the celebration of the Day of National Enlighteners, the Agricultural Academy, in cooperation with the Faculty of Biology and the Faculty of Agronomy, organized a Scientific Session and an exhibition. The event highlighted the professor's scientific contributions, the rich archive he left behind, and his impact on practical agronomy.



A special guest was the historian of Rotary Bulgaria, Tsvyatko Kadijski, who introduced the audience to the Rotary life of the last president of the Sofia Rotary Club before its ban in 1941. Excerpts from Toni Bachurova's film Uprooted to the Core were also screened. Awards for the competition on the topic "Prof. Atanasov and His Contributions" were presented. It was particularly gratifying to learn that just days before the celebration, on October 1, a beautifully crafted commemorative plaque was unveiled in the main lobby near the entrance to the auditorium of the Faculty of Biology (formerly Agronomy). The plaque, set in an oak frame on a birch base, features a portrait of Atanasov and information about him in both Bulgarian and English.
