THE OBJECT OF ROTARY

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

First - The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

Second - High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

Third - The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

Fourth - The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE MONTH

January is Vocational Service Month in Rotary, a time to recognize and celebrate the importance of integrity, professional excellence, and service in our vocations. As **one of Rotary's Five Avenues of Service**, Vocational Service calls on Rotarians to use their skills, knowledge, and expertise to serve others while upholding high ethical standards in business and professional life.

What is Vocational Service?

Vocational Service is the essence of Rotary. It is the way Rotarians bring their professions into service, using their careers as a means to make a difference. It is about:

- Demonstrating high ethical standards in business and professions
- Advancing professional development through mentorship and education
- Encouraging integrity and fairness in workplaces and communities
- · Applying professional expertise to address societal challenges

At the heart of Vocational Service is The Four-Way Test, a simple yet powerful ethical guide that ensures our actions are rooted in honesty, fairness, goodwill, and benefit to all.

How Can Rotarians Engage in Vocational Service?

There are many ways to put Vocational Service into action, such as:

- Mentoring and Career Guidance Support young professionals and students by sharing career insights, leadership advice, and industry expertise.
- Recognizing Ethical Leadership Honor individuals in your community who demonstrate integrity, professionalism, and a commitment to service.
- Skill-Based Community Service Use your professional skills to support Rotary service projects, such as providing legal aid, financial literacy training, medical services, or vocational education.
- Encouraging Ethical Business Practices Promote integrity and transparency in the workplace and advocate for ethical decision-making in all professional dealings.

Making an Impact Through Our Work

Vocational Service reminds us that our professions are not just a means of earning a living but a platform for creating positive change. Whether we are educators, healthcare providers, business leaders, engineers, or entrepreneurs, we all have the power to use our expertise for good.

As we observe Vocational Service Month, let's challenge ourselves to integrate service, integrity, and leadership into our professional lives. By doing so, we strengthen our communities and uphold **Rotary's motto of "Service Above Self."**

Life Continues in Earthquake-Affected Regions: Hopeful Efforts from Aknehir to Tavla

Months have passed since the devastating earthquake, yet its effects are still deeply felt. Thousands of families living in container cities continue to rely on support and solidarity in their efforts to return to normalcy. In this context, various social projects are ongoing in neighborhoods like Aknehir, Sinanlı, Ballıöz, Yeniçağ, and Tavla, as well as in container cities such as Abdurrahman Melek and Kore Dostluk, to help heal the wounds of the affected communities.

Psychological Support Through Group Therapy in Neighborhoods

The trauma caused by the earthquake has profoundly impacted both the psychological and social lives of individuals. Group therapy sessions held in Aknehir, Sinanlı, Ballıöz, Yeniçağ, and Tavla have become vital steps toward individual and collective recovery. These sessions provide a sense of togetherness and help revive hope and solidarity among participants.

With the guidance of expert psychologists, these group therapy sessions address participants' concerns, foster a supportive environment, and guide them in adapting to life after the disaster. Attendees leave these sessions feeling strengthened and reassured that they are not alone.

Special Training for Children and Families in Container Cities

In the Abdurrahman Melek and Kore Dostluk container cities, special privacy education sessions are being held for children, along with informative meetings for families. These programs aim to protect children both physically and emotionally during this challenging time, fostering awareness through age-appropriate lessons.

Families are also receiving guidance on building healthy communication with their children, understanding their needs, and being mindful of potential risks. These sessions not only strengthen children but also empower families to navigate the rebuilding process more effectively.

Life Goes On, But Challenges Persist

Life in the earthquake-affected regions continues, but the challenges of living in container cities cannot be ignored. Many families are still waiting to transition to permanent housing and face daily struggles to meet even basic needs. The support of various sectors of society is crucial to making life in these regions more sustainable.

Let us not forget: solidarity and hope make us stronger. By continuing your support for the earthquake-affected regions, we can rebuild lives and create a brighter future together.




ROTARY CHILDREN HOUSE

This fund was established in May 2022 in honor of Alain Merheje, late husband of President Nairy Merheje, of Lebanese origin, who passed away under tragic circumstances in May 2022. Lebanon was his beloved country so the family, wishto support and contribute in any way possible in aid of children of Lebanon, specifically by contributing to and supporting a children's hospital in Lebanon for children who are in a desperate situation especially now, due to thedevastation caused by the ongoing war. A suitable Children's Hospital will be identified in Lebanon and under the guidance of Rotary Lebanon we will implement this project. Our contribution will help in alleviating pain andhardship for many and any contribution for this worthy cause would be most welcome.

The substantial amount of approx. Euros 9,500 was raised before, during and after the Gala dinner.

This in addition to the €11,000 already held in the Alain Merheje Fund now amounts to almost €20,500, which will be transferred to R.C. Nicosia Aspelia in order to effect and achieve a Global Grant, if possible, so that the objective of substantially assisting a Lebanese Children's hospital in Lebanon is effected.



As the experts informed us, this donation will have a very positive effect on children with autism who, due to the specificity of the condition, benefit greatly from cycling.



Dear Friends,

On February 23, 1905, Paul Harris and his friends gathered around a simple yet powerful idea – to serve and make the world a better place for people.

Their brilliant idea led to the creation of Rotary as a movement that continues to drive positive change worldwide.

Today, Rotary is one of the largest non-governmental organizations in the world, dedicated to community service, with nearly 1.2 million members united by a shared commitment to improving lives, promoting peace, and building lasting connections. The spirit of the Founders lives on in every project, every Rotarian, and every act of service, inspiring us all to be the change we wish to see in the world.

As we approach the 120th anniversary of Rotary's founding, its first area of focus—peacebuilding and conflict resolution—remains more relevant than ever. For many years, this topic seemed abstract to much of the world, including myself, my family, friends, and colleagues. I now realize how fortunate I have been to be spared the misfortune suffered by millions worldwide who have fallen victim to violence and the violation of fundamental human rights.

Peace and conflict are closely interconnected. Peace does not mean the complete absence of conflict. Norwegian sociologist Johan Galtung defines peace as the absence of violence in all its forms and the constructive unfolding of conflict.

Peace exists where people interact without violence and manage their conflicts positively—respecting the legitimate needs and interests of all parties involved.

As individuals and as Rotarians, we do not accept war, but we must understand why conflicts arise. No matter how difficult they may be to manage, we must not give up. It is our moral obligation.

What can we do?

We can strive to better understand what others are saying instead of insisting solely on the correctness of our own perspective. At the heart of this effort lies dialogue. Societies with stronger mechanisms for dialogue thrive. Everyone can contribute to fostering better dialogue. This is why Rotary implements various projects focused on building conflict resolution skills. Recognizing the importance of these issues, The Rotary Foundation funds education in Rotary Peace Centers. I am proud to announce that a candidate from District 2482, Angela Antonova, has been selected. In 2025, she will participate in the certification program at the Rotary Peace Center in Istanbul. Her commitment upon completing the program is to lead initiatives for social change, including working with young people—students and pupils—on programs for conflict resolution and countering radicalization and terrorism.

Many clubs in the district recognize the need to foster conflict resolution skills, empathy, communication, and cultural understanding. Initiatives may include workshops, training sessions, or curriculum development for both young people and adults, helping to prevent violence and promote peaceful dispute resolution.

Creating an environment of positive peace is a key focus of the **Peace Conference in Istanbul** (February 20–22, 2025), which will be held under the patronage of **Stephanie Urchick**, **President of Rotary International**.

The event is a wonderful opportunity to celebrate Rotary's 120th anniversary and explore more ways to achieve positive peace—a peace where conflicts are resolved, and sustainable, balanced coexistence among people with different views is fostered.

On the opening day, February 20, there will also be a meeting of the International Country Committees (ICC), where global ideas for peace will be transformed into future projects for dialogue and friendship. Don't miss this meeting, which will bring together over 600 committee sections from different countries. A huge thank you to all the Rotary clubs that hosted my visits in January: Gorna Banya, Sofia Triaditsa, Sofia Serdika, Sofia City, Botevgrad, Sofia Vazrazhdane, Sofia, Sofia Balkan, Sofia Capital, Sofia Vitosha, Gabrovo, Sevlievo.

A traveling "exhibition" of horrors showcasing the devastating effects of addiction on individuals and their families. Stories of people who have escaped the grip of drug dependency, advice from specialists, confidential consultations, and interactive meetings with young audiences. The initiative includes film screenings, activities in sports, arts, and science—offering every young person an opportunity to discover a positive path forward.

Even before the panels were installed, young people revealed to us a **new and growing threat**—**gambling addiction among children**. The root cause is **easy access to online betting** and the lack of effective control.

Through this unique approach, Rotarians from a club with a long history mark their new rebirth—32 years since the restoration of Rotary in Burgas.
