The month is also a time for organizations, communities, and individuals to unite in raising awareness and taking action to ensure that safe water and sanitation are available for everyone, everywhere. One of the most prominent global organizations championing this cause is **Rotary International**, with its decades-long commitment to solving water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) issues in underserved communities.

**Rotary's Role in Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene -** Rotary International is a global network of community leaders dedicated to making a lasting difference through service projects that address some of the world's most pressing challenges. Rotary's focus on WASH is one of the cornerstones of its global mission, which aims to improve the lives of individuals and communities by addressing the root causes of poverty, illness, and inequality.



Furthermore, **Rotary's Global Water**, **Sanitation**, **and Hygiene Programs** work with local governments, communities, and partner organizations to design and implement sustainable solutions that meet the needs of specific regions.

# **Key Projects and Initiatives in March**

Throughout Water Sanitation & Hygiene Month, Rotary clubs across the globe intensify their efforts to raise awareness, fund projects, and provide hands-on service in local communities. In March, the focus is placed on key activities such as:

- 1. Fundraising for Clean Water Projects: Many Rotary clubs launch fundraising campaigns in March to support clean water initiatives. These funds go toward building wells, water filtration systems, and sanitation facilities in areas that lack basic water infrastructure.
- 2. **Education and Awareness Campaigns**: Rotary members frequently organize workshops and seminars on water sanitation and hygiene, targeting schools, community leaders, and local governments. The goal is to educate individuals about the importance of maintaining clean water sources and practicing good hygiene to prevent disease.
- 3. Local Clean-Up and Hygiene Drives: Rotary clubs often engage in grassroots activities such as local clean-up initiatives, distributing soap and hygiene kits to underserved populations, and promoting handwashing and sanitation education.
- 4. **Advocacy for Policy Change**: In addition to on-the-ground work, Rotary also advocates for stronger national and international policies that prioritize water, sanitation, and hygiene, especially in developing countries where resources are limited.

Industrial development, driven by human needs, and the transportation of industrial products across countries and even continents have led to increased carbon dioxide emissions, creating serious environmental issues that pose a growing threat to human life.




# RC Nicosia Salamis organised an instructive educational and valuable conference with Cyprus Biobank -Cyprus D2452

# Rotary Club of Kyrenia's 55th Anniversary Dinner - "Night of Remembrance, Recognition and Celebration" -Cyprus D2452

On March 19, 2025, the Rotary Club of Kyrenia held its 55th Anniversary Dinner, titled "Night of Remembrance, Recognition and Celebration," at the Cleopatra Hotel in Nicosia, Cyprus. The event brought together current and former members, Rotarians from across the island, dignitaries, prospective members, and friends to honor the club's remarkable legacy. Founded in Kyrenia in 1970, the club has operated in exile in Nicosia since 1974 after forced displacement and remains one of only two in the world granted special permission by Rotary International to function outside its original geographic territory.

In her opening remarks, Club President Marina Gavriel reflected on the club's deep roots in service and community care. She recounted early initiatives such as establishing a blood bank and donating to local hospitals and shared how members planned to build a nursing home in Kyrenia—an effort supported by generous land donations from Rotarians but interrupted by the events of 1974. After displacement, the club refocused its efforts on supporting Kyrenian refugees, funding playgrounds in refugee areas, donating medical equipment, and upholding Rotary values with quiet determination and heartfelt commitment.

The evening featured moving tributes to three long-serving members:

The late Agathoclis Agathocleous was a devoted member whose legacy continues to inspire the Rotary Club of Kyrenia. A native of Kontemenos in the Kyrenia district, he combined professional success with an unwavering commitment to community service. He joined the club in 1992 and quickly became a trusted Treasurer—a role he held from 1995 until his untimely passing—and a cherished friend to many. Already recognized during his lifetime as a Paul Harris Fellow, he served with generosity, optimism, and deep commitment, particularly through his leadership in the club's annual "Kyrenia Day" events, where he played a key role in securing support for local institutions. Agathoclis was a beacon of humility, warmth, and steadfast service, and his memory remains a guiding light for the club's ongoing work.

Doros Moumtzis, who joined the Rotary Club of Kyrenia in 1979, was honored as a Paul Harris Fellow at the event in recognition of his decades of faithful service and quiet leadership. A two-term president and longtime board member, Doros contributed to countless initiatives that highlighted both Rotary values and the cultural heritage of Kyrenia. He participated in international Rotary conferences and worked closely with local and regional Rotary leaders, always known for his kindness, humility, and generous spirit. Even today, he remains a vital presence, most visibly during the club's visits to the Makarios Hospital, where he helps bring joy to children with the same heartfelt dedication he has shown for over four decades.

Yiannis Papaioannou, who served as club president in 2005–2006 and now as vice president, was also recognized as a Paul Harris Fellow at the event. A civil engineer and former mayor of Karavas, Yiannis brought both professional expertise and deep civic commitment to his Rotary work. During his presidency, he focused on strengthening the club's ties with community organizations from the Kyrenia district, organizing fundraising events and securing sponsorships for local athletic clubs, cultural associations, and even the publication of a book preserving the educational history of Kyrenia. He also played a key role in the club's "Kyrenia Day" initiative. Known for his methodical thinking, generosity, and ever-positive spirit, he continues to offer invaluable guidance and support to the club. His dedication to public service—both within and beyond Rotary—embodies the values the club seeks to uphold.

# Rotary Club of Kyrenia's 55th Anniversary Dinner - "Night of Remembrance, Recognition and Celebration" -Cyprus D2452

The event balanced remembrance with renewal—honoring past contributions while calling new generations to carry the torch. As President Marina concluded:

"Today, our club may be small in number, but it is great in thirst and dedication to continue the work of our predecessors. With full awareness of our historical responsibility, we continue to serve Rotary ideals, support the vulnerable, and actively contribute to civil society, both in Cyprus and abroad. Together, let us write the next chapter of our history."







# Breakout Session on Cyprus at the 2025 Presidential Peace Conference in İstanbul Cyprus D2452

On Friday 21st February between 13:45 and 15:00 there was a breakout session on Cyprus, titled "Integrating Unofficial Diplomacy and Civil Society Engagement in Cyprus Peacebuilding".

The moderators were Christina Covotsou-Patroclou, a Past District Governor and member of the Rotary Club of Limassol-Berengaria Cosmopolitan, Cyprus and Sertaç Gümüş, a Past Assistant Governor and member of the Rotary Club of Kyrenia St. Hilarion, Cyprus.

The panelists were Maria Hadjipavlou, an associate professor in the department of social and political science at the University of Cyprus and Sertaç Sonan, head of the political science and international relations department of Cyprus International University and director of the Centre for Cyprus and Mediterranean Studies

The Cyprus breakout session was very well attended with around 350 persons in the audience, where the maximum capacity of the room was 384. Elizabeth Spehar, Assistant Secretary-General for peacebuilding support, UN Department of Political and Peacebuilding Affairs was among the audience, which included many RI directors and dignitaries.

After half a century of intermittent negotiations in Cyprus, official talks have stagnated because of polarized positions. The panel described how Rotary members in Cyprus are setting an example by working together to develop programs and projects that benefit both societies and building strong friendships among members of the Rotary community. Integrating civil society expertise in the diplomatic process increases citizen support for reaching and implementing an agreement. The panelists discussed the challenges Cypriot civil society faces to promote an approach that emphasizes relationships and dialogue in both official and unofficial diplomatic efforts.

At one point Tashtan Altuner, a Past Deputy District Governor and member of the Rotary Club of Nicosia Sarayönü from Cyprus, participant in the Peacebuilding workshop held at the Carter School for Conflict Resolution and Peacebuilding in November 2024, was called to the stage to talk about the workshop and the Rotary Clubs of Cyprus commitment to working together.

Later, in the early evening, on the same day around 60 Rotarians from Cyprus gathered at the Ledra Palace Hotel, located in the buffer zone of Nicosia, in the presence of Rotary International President Stephanie R. Urchick, who joined us at the meeting organized by PDDG Tashtan Altuner.

President Urchick was invited to visit Cyprus by PDG Christina Covotsou Patroclou last year, to witness the co-operation between Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot Rotarians, just after the Presidential Peace Conference held in Istanbul Turkey from 20th to 22nd February 2025. 

Rotary Club Dupnitsa continues to invest in the health and future of the children in our city!










#### **Cross Safely with Rotary Club Nova Zagora**



## Preventive Check-ups for Primary School Teachers in Mezdra Municipality Rotary club Mezdra

Among women, breast cancer is the most common type of malignant disease. According to the World Health Organization, over 12 million people are diagnosed with breast cancer every year, and around 7.5 million die from the disease. In early 2021, the World Health Organization declared breast cancer the most widespread oncological disease among the global population. One of the main reasons for this is that it is often diagnosed at a late stage, when the chances of effective treatment are small. In Bulgaria, around 3,500 women are diagnosed with breast cancer annually. It is important to note that if detected early, the disease can be treated. Therefore, oncologists recommend increasing public awareness of risk factors and symptoms, as well as conducting regular preventive check-ups with specialists. 






# World Rotaract Week Digital Tools for Active Communities March 11 "Bytheriver" Niš
