A shining example is the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland in Ontario, whose members support a program providing hot meals to people facing homelessness and food insecurity. On any given evening, the Soup Shack run by Feed Windsor-Essex serves up to 130 people, offering nourishment and a sense of community and care.

Club member and Past District Governor Aruna Koushik got the club involved after seeing a news segment about the Soup Shack.

Koushik collaborated with club members to quickly approve the purchase of a stove, pots, and pans for its new permanent space. Soon after, club members met with the Soup Shack team, toured the new location, and presented a check for 3,000 Canadian dollars (about US\$2,000) to support its efforts. They also committed to volunteering their time to prepare and serve meals once the facility is operational.

This exemplifies how Rotary members can come together to address community needs, foster engagement, and make a tangible impact. By identifying opportunities for service and mobilizing resources, we not only support those in need but also strengthen our bonds with each other and with the communities we serve.

As we embrace the renewal that spring offers, let's take inspiration from the Windsor-Roseland club. Consider these ways to reinvigorate engagement within your club:

**Identify emerging needs:** Stay attuned to the evolving challenges in your communities. Engage with local organizations to understand where your club's support can make the most difference.

During this month, we focus especially on projects that support young people—because one of Rotary's core values is to inspire the next generation and help them reach their full potential. We believe that the more we pass on the idea of "Service Above Self" to youth, the stronger and more lasting our impact will be.

Interact: First Step into Service

Interact Clubs are for young people aged 12 to 18. These clubs give students the chance to learn about teamwork, leadership, and community service. It's more than just a school activity—it's the beginning of their journey as future leaders.

Young Interactors learn how to help others, solve problems creatively, and understand different cultures. Many of them later become Rotaractors and eventually, full Rotary members.

Rotaract: Young Spirit, Real Impact

Rotaract Clubs are for young adults aged 18 to 30. These clubs help them grow as leaders, plan creative projects, and take action in their communities. Rotaract is a space for young people to learn leadership and make a difference—locally and globally.

Many Rotarians began their service journey as Rotaractors. That's why Rotaract is so important for Rotary's future.

Working Together: Stronger Connections

It is very important to build strong partnerships between Interact, Rotaract, and Rotary clubs. Young people today are full of ideas, energy, and creativity. They often lead successful and innovative projects. We, as Rotarians, should support them, respect their leadership, and share our experience when needed.

Let's work with them—not just for them.

RYLA: Discovering Leadership

The Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) program is one of our best ways to support youth. It helps young people (ages 15–30) discover their strengths, grow their confidence, and become responsible leaders.

In RYLA, they learn about teamwork, communication, ethical leadership, and community service. It's not about teaching leadership—it's about helping them find their own leadership style.

Youth Exchange: Life-Changing Experiences

The Rotary Youth Exchange Program gives students (ages 15–19) a chance to live in another country, learn a new language, and experience a different culture. There are two main types:

- \* Long-Term Exchange: One school year abroad
- \* Short-Term Exchange: 3-6 weeks, usually during summer

Through Youth Exchange, students become open-minded, independent, and more understanding of the world. They are also peace ambassadors who build global friendships.

Mentorship: Guiding the Way

Mentorship is a key part of our youth work. As Rotarians, we can guide young people by sharing our life and work experience. We give them not only knowledge, but also inspiration, courage, and hope.

Conclusion: Youth Are Our Future

Every investment we make in youth is an investment in the future of Rotary. Today's youth are tomorrow's service leaders. Let's walk with them, listen to them, and build a better future—together.

# COMPLETION OF FIRST COHORT PEACE FELLOWS PROGRAM AT BAU FUTURE CAMPUS ISTANBUL

Years of devotion and dedicated is now bearing fruit for peace. BAU, TRF, RI, Host Area D2420 and D2430/D2440 are now celebrating realisation of peace fellows' on-site education. As they are departing to leave and travel back to their homes, İstanbul is not whispering farewell to their ears. Rather yearning for their arrival in early Jan 2026 to receive successful implementation recognition, of their Peace Initiative Projects.

Fellows have come from a diverse culture of countries, including Bangladesh, Bulgaria, Egypt, Jordan, Israel, Kenya, Pakistan, Somali, South Africa, Türkiye, USA and Yemen. BAU campus offered an excellent facility. Including lodgings inside the dormitories, cafeteria, sports centre, library, and infirmary. Remotely situated in greenery forests, BAU Future Campus is easily accessible by road and metro.

They have received lectures designed around a modular curriculum for a 10 week duration. Each model has been augmented with site visits to various historical and cultural locations, including Ankara the capital city of Türkiye. Local Rotary clubs assisted enthusiastically these stopovers. Fellows have been received by provincial administrations, authorities and the civilian organisation to exchange ideas and thoughts. First Field Visit - Giresun & Ordu

On February 27–28, 2025, with the participation of BAU staff and fellows, RPC conducted the first field visit to Giresun and Ordu. The visit focused on sustainable agriculture, green growth, and the role of women's labor in local development.

Peace Fellows had insightful meetings with Ordu Chamber of Commerce President Levent Karlıbel and Ordu Metropolitan Municipality Business Development Director Sancar Eser, discussing regional trade, sustainability efforts, and the impact of climate change on agriculture.

On the second day, Peace Fellows stayed at Zifin Hotel and attended an online lecture by Prof. Ayşe Özcan-Buckley, who provided an in-depth analysis of hazelnut production in Giresun and its economic significance at both local and national levels.

This inspiring visit offered a valuable opportunity to observe sustainable development in action and engage with local stakeholders







#### Workshop 2)

On Friday, March 7th, our Peace Fellows had the pleasure of joining a captivating weaving workshop led by Fırat Neziroğlu. They explored the harmony of color, texture, and form while immersing themselves in the deep-rooted traditions of Anatolian weaving. Thank you for guiding us through this enriching experience! Fırat Neziroğlu is a distinguished artist who reinterprets traditional Anatolian weaving through a contemporary lens. For over 25 years, he has journeyed across Anatolia, researching and reviving ancient fabrics and looms, and collaborating with local artisans to preserve this cultural heritage. His art has been exhibited in global cities such as London, Paris, and New York, with custom pieces created for dignitaries including the Queens of England and Thailand.

He has been featured at renowned platforms like the Lausanne Biennale and New York Fashion Week. As a Wearable Technologies Advisor at Information Valley, he continues to innovate in the field of sustainable textiles and bio-based fibers. His signature technique is now taught in textile programs around the world, and his international workshops—"Weaving Like Fırat Neziroğlu"—continue to inspire new generations of artists and designers.



#### Workshop 3)

As part of our extracurricular activities, we had a wonderful perfume-making workshop with Koku Akademisi. The session started with a brief history of scents, then our fellows learned to identify base, middle, and top notes, and how to blend them into a balanced fragrance.

Each fellow created their own unique perfume—choosing scents that reflect their personality and bring them joy. Now, they carry a special fragrance that will always remind them of this meaningful day at the Rotary Peace Center.







Field Visit 2: Southern Türkiye

The second field visit began in Mardin, where the Rotary Peace Center staff and fellows engaged with impactful civil society organizations and visited Mardin Bahçeşehir College — a prominent educational institution shaping the region's future.

In Mardin, the group met with two inspiring organizations dedicated to women's empowerment and community development:

ÇATOM (Multi-Purpose Community Center) provides education, vocational training, and certification programs to support refugee and local women entering the workforce. Through the center's workshops, women can also create and sell handmade products, generating sustainable income.

MOKİD (Mardin Joint Women's Cooperation Association) offers literacy courses, vocational training, and psychological, social, and legal counseling. Their women-led initiative, MOKİD Mutfak, is a commercial kitchen that fosters entrepreneurship and economic independence for women.

Both organizations are making important contributions to gender equality, social change, and sustainable development.

The Rotary Peace Center extends its heartfelt thanks to all the individuals and teams working tirelessly to create a better, more peaceful future. Special appreciation goes to Mr. Ömer Boz, Principal of Bahçeşehir College, for his invaluable support and commitment to education and community impact.





Gaziantep: The second stop of the field visit was Gaziantep, where the Rotary Peace Center staff and fellows continued their learning journey.

The day began with a visit to **KAGİDEM**, a center that supports women entrepreneurs through training, consultancy, and mentorship. The team observed how the organization empowers women to launch their own businesses and contribute to the local economy.

Later, the group joined an event hosted by **Gaziantep Rotary Club and Rotary District 2430**. Local Rotarians shared their impactful earthquake relief work, including the distribution of emergency supplies, setup of temporary housing, and mobile hospitals. Their dedication to community response in times of crisis was deeply appreciated.

The visit also included meetings with **Bahar Organization and Welthungerhilfe (WHH)**, both providing essential humanitarian aid to refugees and local communities in Turkey and Syria. Their efforts in health, food security, and resilience-building programs were highlighted as key contributions to regional stability. During the same event, the group met **Ayşe Ceren Bilgin, Project Manager for the Union of Medical Care and Relief Organizations (UOSSM)**. She shared valuable insights into the organization's medical and humanitarian work in vulnerable communities.

The Rotary Peace Center extends its sincere thanks to all participants for their inspiring work and generous contributions. Their efforts underscored the importance of collaboration and collective action in supporting and rebuilding communities.













The final stop of the field visit was Hatay, a region deeply impacted by the earthquake. The Rotary Peace Center staff and fellows were honored to host JCI and Save the Children at Bahçeşehir Antakya College, where they learned about the organizations' crucial work in disaster response, community recovery, and child protection.


**JCI** is a network of young leaders and entrepreneurs who coordinate volunteer efforts in disaster zones, distribute aid, and develop community rebuilding projects. They also collaborate with local authorities to support recovery processes.

**Save the Children** focuses on protecting children in crisis situations by ensuring their safety, offering psychosocial support, distributing essentials, and ensuring continued access to education. Their childcentered approach is essential for long-term recovery.

The team expressed their deep gratitude to **Hatay Bahçeşehir College** for their warm hospitality. Special thanks were given to **Sefer Kaplan**, founder and president of **BK Hatay**, and the entire school team for their incredible support in hosting this meaningful gathering.


A special acknowledgment was also given to **Yusuf Gasseloğlu**, who translated The Little Prince into Arabic with Latin letters for the **Anadolu Dillerinde Küçük Prens** project by **Sivil Düşün**, aimed at preserving regional languages. His work makes classic literature more accessible to Arabic-speaking communities, offering children in Antakya the chance to enjoy the story in their native language.

Field Visit 3: Ankara

On Monday, April 7th, we carried out the first stop of the Ankara field visit with a visit to the FAO in Türkiye & Sub-regional Office for Central Asia.

Our visit to the FAO in Türkiye & Sub-regional Office for Central Asia started with a brief information session about FAO's structure, mission, and accomplishments in Türkiye and the region. The lively debate that followed afterward included FAO's monitoring and assessment mechanisms, contributions to the Turkish Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, activities in conflict zones, and its partners, among which is Bahçeşehir University as of 2022. Other themes of particular importance were the empowerment of disaster-ridden and refugee communities through capacity building, family farming to conserve biodiversity, and the future of food. We thank the FAO Office for their time and invaluable insights.





On the first day of field visit in Ankara continued with a tour of Anıtkabir, the mausoleum of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk. As the founding father of the Turkish Republic, Atatürk's legacy is deeply embedded in this site. Anıtkabir stands as a powerful representation of Turkey's national identity, secular statehood, and modernizing reforms. Mustafa Kemal Atatürk once said, "Peace at home, peace in the world." His vision for a modern, peaceful Republic was rooted in education, gender equality, legal reform, and diplomacy. These ideals remain vital in efforts to build inclusive and resilient societies today.

In the afternoon, the Fellows met with representatives from the AK Party Foreign Affairs Unit, who shared their work on diaspora engagement and citizen diplomacy. The unit prepares regular reports on the Turkish diaspora's status and needs, and maintains close collaboration with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs through monthly briefings. Their efforts focus on understanding and responding to the needs of Turkish citizens living abroad, ensuring a sustained and strategic connection with global Turkish communities.



On the second day of their visit to Ankara, the Rotary Peace Center staff and fellows had the privilege of visiting the Embassy of Canada. The discussions focused on strengthening Canada—Turkey relations, particularly in areas like immigration and peacebuilding. Holly White, Second Secretary at the Embassy and a Rotary Peace Fellow alumna, shared her heartfelt perspective on peace from the viewpoints of a peacebuilder, a Rotarian, and a diplomat. The conversation also highlighted Canada's diplomatic approach and its commitment to global peacebuilding efforts. The team expressed sincere gratitude to Holly White for her warm hospitality and valuable insights.







Later in the day, the group visited the Department of International Relations at METU, where they engaged in discussions on regional conflicts, grassroots civil society movements, and peace and security theories. The visit emphasized how academic knowledge informs diplomatic practice. The Rotary Peace Center extended sincere thanks to Prof. Özgehan Şenyuva, Prof. Meliha Altunışık, Assist. Prof. Dr. Derya Göçer, and all participating faculty members for their warm welcome and insightful contributions. Their perspectives created an inspiring space for dialogue between academia and peace practitioners.





As the final meetings of their second day, the Rotary Peace Center staff and fellows visited the **International** Labour Organization (ILO) Turkey Office and the Directorate of Communications.

At the **ILO Turkey Office**, the group gained valuable insights into the organization's role in setting global labor standards and promoting social justice. Discussions focused on the ILO's efforts to improve labor conditions, protect workers' rights, and strengthen social security systems, with a special emphasis on Turkey's labor policies and strategies. The ILO representatives provided an overview of the organization's history and ongoing work to ensure decent work for all.







The final visit of the day was to the Directorate of Communications, where the team learned about Turkey's media policies, digital transformation, public relations, and strategic communication efforts. The discussion highlighted the critical role of communication strategies in diplomacy, especially in using media to manage public perception and influence both domestic and international audiences. They also presented on humanitarian aid assistance, underscoring the importance of effective communication in coordinating such efforts.





Field Visit 4: Cyprus

The Rotary Peace Center staff and fellows are sincerely grateful to **Mustafa Akıncı**, former President of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus, for kindly welcoming them.

As part of the **Rotary Peace Center certificate program at Bahçeşehir University**, the Peace Fellows had the honor of meeting Mr. Akıncı and engaging in an insightful discussion on the Cyprus issue. The team deeply appreciates his generosity in sharing his experiences and perspectives.





During their recent trip, the Rotary Peace Center staff and fellows had the honor of visiting the TRNC Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Minister Ertuğruloğlu provided a comprehensive overview of the Cyprus issue in its historical context and explained the official stance of the TRNC, emphasizing that a two-state solution is the only viable path forward, supported by solid reasoning. He also highlighted the crucial role Turkey plays in supporting this ongoing process.

Foreign Minister Tahsin Ertuğruloğlu has been serving as the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus since 2016. His leadership and diplomatic efforts continue to play a key role in shaping the future of the island.





On the last day of their visit to Cyprus, the Peace Fellows from the Rotary Peace Center at Bahçeşehir University began their day with a meeting with Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, Chair of the Department of Political Science & International Relations and Director of the Cyprus Policy Center. He delivered an insightful seminar on the Cyprus Conflict, providing valuable perspectives to support their research on peace-related topics.

Under the guidance of Prof. Dr. Ahmet Sözen, Rotary Peace Center visited Varosha (Kapalı Maraş). This area, once a bustling resort town, has remained closed since the 1974 Turkish invasion of Cyprus and stands as a key symbol of the island's division. The visit provided valuable insights into its historical and political importance in the context of the Cyprus conflict.

### **COUNSIL OF LEGALISATION 2025**

About 480 Rotary members from around the world, each representing a single Rotary district, are gatheredApril at the Hyatt Regency in Chicago, Illinois, USA, for the 2025 Council on Legislation. They will vote on 78 proposals to change Rotary International's constitutional documents.

"This Council represents the heart of Rotary's democratic process and the best of our international spirit," said Rotary International President Stephanie A. Urchick at the opening session. "The gathering is one of Rotary's most powerful expressions of multiculturalism. Here, voices from every corner of the globe come together – not to compete, but to collaborate."

The Council on Legislation, which meets every three years, is Rotary's version of a congress. Representatives selected by their districts gather to consider proposals designed to move Rotary forward and adapt to the changing times.

<u>Download preliminary voting results</u>

#### Monday, 14 April

Representatives approved a measure to decrease the number of members needed to charter a new Rotary club from 20 to 15. Supporters said it would remove barriers to starting new clubs and help Rotary grow and expand its reach. The Council also defeated a pair of measures to set an age limit for Rotaractors. Opponents cited the low number of current Rotaractors over the age of 40 in arguing that limits were unnecessary and said such restrictions could force members out of Rotary.

They also rejected limiting the number of honorary members a club can have to 5% of the club's active membership. Opponents noted that many clubs use honorary membership to stay in contact with former members, many of them longtime Rotarians with valuable expertise to offer.







### **COUNSIL OF LEGALISATION 2025**

#### Tuesday, 15 April

After 45 minutes of debate, the Council approved an increase in the dues that every member pays to Rotary International of US\$3.50 in the first year and US\$3.75 in the following two years. Supporters said the increase is needed to meet rising costs and continue providing essential resources and services to clubs. They said that the dues increase is below the inflation rate, indicating that RI is working to cut costs and manage revenues responsibly. Opponents felt that dues increases may hurt membership and wanted more transparency from RI about what cost-cutting has been done.

Representatives also approved a measure allowing the Board to test additional new governance models in districts beyond those approved by the Council three years ago. A governance pilot is currently being tested in districts in RIBI, New Zealand, and Australia, with some modest success in membership growth. Supporters noted that the system in which governors oversee districts dates back to the early days of Rotary. They argue that trying new governance models can help Rotary adapt to future needs and train and develop new leaders.

In another measure, representatives agreed to allow the Board to consider factors such as culture and language, not just the number of Rotarians, in deciding zone boundaries.

#### Wednesday, 16 April

Representatives voted to require that the five-year financial forecast presented at the beginning of each Council include updates on specific process improvements and cost-reduction measures taken by RI. Several representatives wanted RI to provide more details about cost reductions to justify any increase in dues.

In a similar measure, the Council approved commissioning a regular professional analysis of processes and cost structures in RI's administration. They declined to require, however, that Rotary's annual report include an itemized list of every expense over US\$1 million.

After considerable debate, the Council voted to make holding a district conference optional.

### RunRotary 2025: Running for a Cause in Antalya, Türkiye

The annual RunRotary 2025 race, held in the heart of Antalya, brought together 136 dedicated Rotarian runners in an inspiring display of athleticism and philanthropy. Through their collective efforts, an impressive 1,500,000 Turkish Lira (USD 40,000) was raised, directly funding the HPV vaccinations for 450 young girls from families receiving social assistance from local municipalities. This initiative underscores Rotary's commitment to community health, ensuring access to preventive care for those in need.





The event also highlighted the generosity of participating individuals and clubs, with M. Cem Alaybeyoğlu leading individual contributions at TL 140,000, followed by Ayla Ergül (TL 105,700) and Ayşe Mine Ergün (TL 93,415). Among the clubs, Antalya Perge Interact Club raised the highest amount with TL 170,305, followed closely by Eskişehir Anadolu Rotary Club (TL 154,000) and Antalya Kaleiçi Rotary Club (TL 146,350). RunRotary 2025 was not only a test of endurance but a triumph of generosity, proving once again that running can change lives.


### "TOGETHER, WE SERVE: A JOURNEY TO HATAY DEĞİRMENYOLU TO NURTURE HOPE THROUGH THE BRIDGE OF FELLOWSHIP"

As Adana Koza Rotary Club, the series of projects we brought to life in Hatay Değirmenyolu-- 200 km away from Adana and severely affected by the February 6, 2023 earthquake--can be seen as projects that bridge distances, foster unity and connection, build bridges of hope and nurture resilience. It was a deeply emotional experience for us, filled with moments that made us say, "We're so glad to be here," and "We're proud to be Rotarians". Beyond the kilometers, it became a remarkable example of solidarity, cooperation, and collective action among Rotary clubs from 2 Rotary districts, Rotarian & Rotaractor collaboration, and Rotary & other NGOs partnership. Additionally, the service projects stood out for the variety of their themes. We implemented various projects with different areas of focus, in terms of education/awareness raising, fulfilling specific community needs, and health screenings.

### WITHIN THE SCOPE OF EDUCATION AND AWARENESS (December 7 and December 25) \*PHASE I – December 7 / EDUCATION AND AWARENESS-RAISING:

Through the collaboration among Adana Koza Rotary Club (RI D 2430), Galatasaray Rotary Club and Galatasaray Rotaract Club (RI D 2420), together we organized and held a full day of simultaneous, multiple interactive educational seminars and awareness-raising events at Değirmenyolu Primary School and Hatay's Defne Değirmenyolu neighborhood. These interactive sessions enabled the participants to share ideas and problems, have access to reliable information, get responses to their questions concerning the topic of the seminar. The education and awareness-raising seminars were as follows:

- 1) "Protecting Eye Health and Preventing the Onset and Progression of Myopia"- Rtn. Prof. Dr. Gülhanım Hacıyakupoğlu (103 students) (followed by an entertaining mini fun and educational quiz)
- 2) "Oral and Dental Health"- Rtc. Dr. Mehmet Kutluhan Uçuk, Rtc. Dt. Gamze Akman & Rtc. Dt. Sıla Başa (for elementary and preschool children; 175 students). After the session, 390 toothbrushes and tubes of toothpaste were distributed.
- 3) "Goal Setting"- Rtn. trainer Belkıs Karabucak (for 8th-grade students)
- 4) "Breast Cancer and Early Diagnosis" Prof. Dr. Arif Güngören (for women living in Değirmenyolu neighborhood and school parents; 120 participants)
- 5) "Cervical Cancer, HPV Vaccine, and Its Importance"- Prof. Dr. Arif Güngören (for women living in Değirmenyolu neighborhood and school parents; 120 participants)
- 6) "Coping with Our Emotions" Rtn.Prof. Dr. Banu İnanç & Specialist Psychological Counselor

### \*PHASE II - December 25 / EDUCATION AND AWARENESS-RAISING

Returning to Hatay Değirmenyolu Primary School for a second time, we implemented a full day of educational and awareness-raising seminars and events through the cooperation of Adana Koza RC and Galatasaray RC:

- 1) "Effective Communication Skills, Courtesy and Etiquette Rules" Rtn. Assist. Prof. Dr. Silvia Akıncı (at the end of the session, participants received books on this topic--provided by RI D.2430--as gifts)
- 2) With the motto "Let's Protect Nature and the Environment, and Care for All Living Beings," we offered three awareness-raising sessions: "Reduce Plastic Use," "Water is Life," and "Let's Learn About and Protect Endangered Species in Our Region" (particularly those in Yumurtalık Nature Reserve and Akyatan Lagoon). These were followed by another fun and educational quiz.





#### WITHIN THE SCOPE OF COMMUNITY NEEDS (December 25, 2024)

1) "Gifts that Embrace with Love" - Through the collaboration of Adana Koza RC and Galatasaray RC, we delivered over 400 heartfelt gifts to students and mothers of Hatay Değirmenyolu Primary School, which serves 317 students. These included colorful wool scarves, hats, gloves, socks, baby clothes, sweets, chocolate, and 30 newborn-clothing gift sets—all to warmly embrace the children and families in the New Year. Many of the scarves and hats were lovingly handmade by our members, their spouses, friends, and family. Volunteers—both familiar and new—responded with touching generosity and support. Members of the Turkey Charity Association (TYSD) Adana Branchalso partnered with us by donating a large number of gift packages and joined us in Değirmenyolu for the gift distribution.

2) "Hygiene Supply Donation"- In response to a need expressed by the community, we provided 336

packages of sanitary products for women.

WITHIN THE SCOPE OF HEALTH SCREENING (December 25, 2024)

"Protecting Heart Health and Preventing Hypertension" - Through cooperation of Adana Koza RC and Galatasaray RC, Rtn. Dr. Seher Evrükeand medical technician Furkan Günüvar provided training to 50 students. Following the session, all students had their blood pressure individually measured. Three students were found to have high blood pressure and were recommended for follow-up. One student showed signs of irregular heart rhythm and was referred to a pediatric cardiology clinic after contacting the family. Follow-up for these students is ongoing.

We believe our Hatay Değirmenyolu project series stand out for its rich content, project variety, wide-ranging and strong partnerships, as well as the support and interest it received from the community. These projects also contributed significantly to the public visibility and perception of Rotary. ### Access is Not a Luxury, It's a Human Right! No Room for Fear!" carried out the Adana Taşköprü Rotary Club

Under the project titled "Access is Not a Luxury, It's a Human Right! No Room for Fear!" carried out by the Adana Taşköprü Rotary Club, 100,000 sanitary pads were distributed in the previous term. Building on the impact of this major social responsibility initiative, the goal was expanded for the new term to distribute 150,000 sanitary pads.

To support women and girls in need, particularly in earthquake-affected areas, active fieldwork was conducted. As part of the project, 35,000 pads were distributed in Antakya Expo Rotary Container City, 45,000 in Antakya Qatar Friendship Container City, 30,000 at the Adana Girls' High School Dormitory, 15,000 in Adana Container City, and 25,000 at Hatay Define Değirmenyolu Primary School.

Thus, the goal of 150,000 sanitary pads was successfully reached, providing significant support to women and girls in the region. This meaningful initiative by the Adana Taşköprü Rotary Club also plays a vital role in raising awareness within the community.

On April 19–20, as **Ankara Kızılay and Antakya Rotaract Clubs**, we carried out a very meaningful and inspiring project in Hatay, a city that is still recovering from the major earthquakes of recent years. We are proud to have contributed to Hatay's rebuilding journey with hope, solidarity, and a strong belief in the power of community. Together, we build a better future.







### D-2420 GLOBAL GRANT 2568623

The Rotary Club of Barbaros Metropolitan (D2420) in Istanbul created the project and became the host club for Global Grant 2568623 to procure three advanced incubators and to train the medical staff at Marmara University Pendik Research and Teaching Hospital in their use. The Rotary Club of Nicosia Sarayönü (D2452) in Cyprus joined the project as the international partner. The project launched in September 2024, aimed to provide advanced incubators for extremely low birth weight micropremature babies, has been completed with the financial support of many clubs in the Istanbul area and two other clubs from Cyprus, namely RC Kyrenia Liman and RC Kyrenia Cosmopolitan.

Three members of RC Nicosia Sarayönü, namely President Behiye Müftüzade and board members Hakkı Müftüzade and Taştan Altuner, travelled to Istanbul to attend the inauguration ceremony at the Marmara University Pendik Research and Teaching Hospital. The ceremony took place on the 14th of April 2025 and was opened by President Almira of RC Barbaros Metropolitan, in attendance there were presidents and members of participating Istanbul clubs, together with the Rotarians from Cyprus. The Dean of the Teaching Hospital together with the Head of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit also attended the inauguration ceremony.

After the speeches a select small group, including Presidents Behiye and Almira were taken to the neonatal intensive care unit, to see the incubators in good use, these advanced incubators are able to care for babies as small as 250g and give them a chance to grow into healthy children.

Through this project Rotary has made a difference and provided the gift of life to many premature babies which otherwise would be left to perish due to lack of necessary incubators.








### RC NICOSIA SALAMIS CELEBRATED THEIR 29TH ANNIVERSARY - CYPRUS D2452





# Rotary Club Stara Zagora Supported a Student Competition on Disaster Response

Rotary Club Stara Zagora, in cooperation with Stara Zagora Municipality, the Local Commission for Combating Juvenile Delinquency (MKBPMPN), the Regional Directorate of Fire Safety and Civil Protection, the Bulgarian Red Cross (BRC), the Public Ombudsman of Stara Zagora Municipality Ivanka Sotirova, and the Young Ombudsmen, organized and held the Municipal Round of the National Student Competition "Disaster, Fire, and Emergency Protection."

With the support of Rotary Club Stara Zagora, the specialized equipment used by the students during the competition was renewed and updated. The goal was to ensure it closely matches real-life conditions that children might face outside the simulation environment. The idea and hope that we are helping highly motivated young people, on whom society can rely in the future, motivated us to stand behind this event. We believe it will leave a lasting impression and that the provided equipment will be used for a long time to come.

Thirteen teams of students from fifth, sixth, and seventh grade participated in the competition. Each team consisted of four competitors and one team leader. The competition included both theoretical and practical sections, aiming to assess and improve the knowledge and skills of Stara Zagora students in the fields of safety and first aid.









# Rotary Club Stara Zagora Supported a Student Competition on Disaster Response

The competition was held in two rounds. The first round included an individual test with 30 questions to be completed in 30 minutes, based on the Ministry of Education's curriculum on actions during disasters, accidents, catastrophes, fires, and first medical aid. The next stage assessed the acquired practical skills and habits for protection through competitive games involving three team members (with the fourth as a substitute). Different team members participated at the various centers.

The practical challenges were divided across several training centers:

- First center: actions during earthquakes and floods;
- Second center: protection during industrial accidents and working with gas masks;
- Third center: response to fires, solving case studies, and working with firefighting equipment.

The final part included actions based on a set case, including demonstrations of first aid — for fractures, open wounds, unconsciousness, and other emergency conditions.

The funds with which Rotary Club Stara Zagora supported the holding of this competition, as well as the upcoming Regional Round of the National Student Competition "Disaster, Fire, and Emergency Protection," were raised during a themed evening organized by the club in February to mark the 120th anniversary of the founding of Rotary International.


