YOUTH SERVICE MONTH

May is Youth Service Month in the Rotary calendar — a time to celebrate the energy, vision, and commitment of young people around the world. This special focus honors the critical role that youth play in shaping a better future and highlights Rotary's investment in nurturing leadership, service, and global citizenship among the next generation.

Youth Service, also known as New Generations Service, is one of Rotary International's five Avenues of Service. It recognizes the positive change that young people bring through their leadership skills, innovative ideas, and community involvement. Throughout May, Rotary clubs around the globe are encouraged to engage youth in service projects, recognize their contributions, and support their personal and professional development.

Rotary supports young leaders through several dynamic programs:

- Rotaract: A global movement of young adults ages 18 and older who develop leadership skills while
 helping their communities. Rotaract clubs operate independently or in partnership with Rotary clubs,
 allowing members to address local challenges with creative solutions.
- *Interact:* Designed for high school students aged 12–18, Interact clubs foster leadership, teamwork, and service-mindedness. These clubs are often school- or community-based and organize projects that make a lasting difference both locally and internationally.
- RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards): This program offers intensive leadership training for
 youth and young adults. Through workshops, outdoor activities, and mentorship, RYLA participants
 build confidence, communication skills, and a deeper sense of purpose.
- **Youth Exchange:** A unique cultural exchange program that gives students the opportunity to live and study abroad for several weeks or up to a year. It fosters global understanding and peace by immersing young people in different cultures.

Youth Service Month is also a time for Rotary clubs to spotlight success stories — the Interactors who led a sustainability project, the Rotaractors who organized a health awareness campaign, or the RYLA alumni who returned to mentor others. These stories inspire and remind communities of the powerful impact young people can have when they are empowered and supported.

More than just a celebration, Youth Service Month is a call to action. It encourages Rotary members to invest time, mentorship, and resources into youth-focused initiatives. Whether through scholarships, career guidance, or collaborative service projects, the goal is to equip young people with the tools they need to lead with integrity and compassion.

This May, let us honor the creativity and courage of young leaders, and recommit ourselves to helping them rise to their full potential — not just this month, but every month. After all, when we empower youth, we all move closer to a brighter future.

I remember the exact moment when I realized the power of Rotary's youth programs. It was a Saturday morning in Australia during my year as a Rotary Youth Exchange student. I stood among a group of young leaders at a Rotary Youth Leadership Awards event. The organizers challenged us to stand on a large tarp spread across the floor and, without stepping off, find a way to fold it in half.

At first, the task seemed simple. But as we moved, strategized, and adjusted, the reality set in — it required teamwork, agility, and constant communication.

Rotaractors and Rotarians guided us, but no one dictated how to succeed. The decisions were ours to make. And then something remarkable happened. Without being instructed, we collectively decided that no one would be left behind as our space on the tarp shrank.

One of our teammates was a person who uses a wheelchair, giving us an opportunity to adapt, ensuring that he was fully part of the experience. We shifted, lifted the tarp, and reconfigured our positions, using our time to think, plan, and act as a team. In the end, we successfully completed the challenge together.

As we celebrated our success, one participant said, "Society works the same way — challenges will come, but instead of leaving people behind, we must find ways to include everyone." It was such a profound thought for someone so young, yet it perfectly captured the essence of our experience .PREVIOUS ISSUE

Interact empowers young people to create service projects with real and lasting impact. Youth Exchange builds global citizens who return home with broader perspectives and stronger leadership skills. RYLA develops young leaders equipped to inspire and mobilize others. All of this is The Magic of Rotary, emerging through the actions of youth. These programs are the heart of Rotary's ability to grow and adapt in a changing world.

But the success of these programs depends on more than young leaders — it requires Rotary members who believe in their potential. I encourage you to sponsor an Interact club, host an exchange student, and support a RYLA participant. Your involvement does more than sustain these programs; it multiplies their impact and ensures that young leaders are not just beneficiaries of Rotary but active contributors.

Dubai, May 24, 2025 – In a grand ceremony held at the luxurious Mandarin Oriental Jumeira hotel in Dubai, Cypriot Peter Ashdjian takes over as the new Rotary Governor of District 2452 of Rotary International, effective July 1, 2025. The new Governor, a fourth-generation Rotarian, expressed his emotion with a deep sense of responsibility. During his inauguration, he stated, "68 years ago, my great-grandfather served as the Governor of the District, then known as District 89, and later on he served as director of the Rotary International. To follow in his footsteps is a deep honor and a duty for me."

In his speech, Peter Ashdjian emphasized Rotary's social responsibility, the need to support regions in need such as Artsakh in Armenia, Sudan, and Palestine (some of the countries in District 2452), and the organization's unity under the motto "Unite for Good." He also stressed that leadership in Rotary means primarily service to communities, Rotary Clubs, and above all, its members.

Cyprus in the Spotlight in 2026

Special emphasis was placed on the upcoming organization of the annual Rotary District Conference in Cyprus in May 2026. The conference holds not only Rotarian significance but also national importance, as it will offer Cyprus the opportunity to showcase itself internationally as a place of hospitality, culture, peace, and intercultural dialogue. It is worth noting that Rotary in Cyprus consists of 19 clubs operating across the island under the official flag of the Republic of Cyprus. Clubs from both communities collaborate seamlessly, making Rotary one of the few organizations that operates in harmony. Through the conference's proceedings and parallel cultural and social activities, Cyprus will showcase its history, traditions, and its role as a beacon of stability in the region. The ceremony in Dubai marked the beginning of a period that brings Cyprus to the forefront of international Rotary activity, with a positive impact on the country's Rotary clubs and the island's global outreach.

What is Rotary?

Rotary is one of the oldest and most recognizable international volunteer organizations in the world. Founded in 1905, it has over 1.4 million members in more than 200 countries and geographical regions. Rotarians work to promote peace, prevent and combat diseases, support maternal and child health, provide access to clean water, education, local economic development, and environmental protection.

In Cyprus, Rotary Clubs actively contribute through their community projects. Examples include:

The creation of a Special Diagnostic Laboratory for childhood cancer at the Karaiskakio Foundation, worth over €400,000.

Similar diagnostic equipment donated to the Americos Argyriou Center for Preventive Pediatrics.

Restoration of the water supply system in the mountainous village of Ora.

Establishment of the first Queen Bee Breeding Center and Honey Quality Laboratory "Melissa Zoi" in Odou, in partnership with the Bank of Cyprus, to restore bee populations lost in devastating fires (over 100 million bees).

In Larnaca, in cooperation with the Bank of Cyprus, the creation of the first inclusive playground for children with mobility challenges, called "Equal Opportunities Park".

During the COVID-19 pandemic, they purchased four fully equipped ICU beds for Nicosia General Hospital and provided medical equipment to Kyrenia Hospital.

Rotary Clubs consistently support various organizations and institutions and also contribute by awarding scholarships to students.

The District 2452, which includes countries from the Middle East, Southern Europe, and Central Asia, is a model of multicultural cooperation and volunteerism. Rotary International holds official consultative status with the United Nations, participating actively in consultations and initiatives for global peace and human development.


Those present were trained in First Aid by professional rescuers-trainers of the National Emergency Aid Center, which included theory and practice by using props in the following training subjects:







RID 2475 - RC SANTORINI OIA Organization of Voluntary Blood Donation

2. ROTARY KLUBA ZRENJANIN – LECTURE ABOUT POLIO

The Rotary Club of Zrenjanin is on April 24, 2025 in the conference hall of the hotel "Vojvodina" organized a lecture dedicated to marking the week of the fight against poliomyelitis. The goal of this event was to inform the membership and citizens about the current situation of poliomyelitis in the world and get acquainted with the latest scientific research in the field of prevention and treatment of this disease.

The lecture was given by the respected Dr. Gaja Pozojević, a specialist pulmonologist and a long-time specialist member of our club, who introduced the attendees to the historical perspective of vaccination, as well as according to the latest data from the World Health Organization. It was especially pointed out that, although the numbercases of poliomyelitis in the global context have significantly decreased, the disease is still a threat population in some regions, primarily in parts of Pakistan and Afghanistan.

Dr. Pozojević explained the difference between attenuated ("numbed") - oral and "dead" parenteral vaccines, pointing out the advantages of oral. He emphasized that the new generation vaccines are being tested for greater safety, but that their widespread application still depends on logistical and financial capacities of countries with limited resources. He also swerved attention to the importance of continuous education of local health workers and citizens, in order to complete immunization of as many children as possible was achieved.

In the discussion that followed, everyone agreed that the Rotary program "End Polio Now" will continue requires active support, both through fundraising and local actions education and promotion of vaccination. This event once again confirmed our commitment club's global initiative to eradicate polio and the local community's contribution to it humanitarian mission.

3. 15.05.-18.05. Friendship that inspires - Rotary meetings from Plitvice to Una with the message of nature conservation

Members of the Rotary Club of Sremska Mitrovica spent an inspiring weekend in Croatia and BiH, enjoying the natural beauty of the Plitvice Lakes and the Una River.

A special experience was provided by the visit to Bihać, where we were warmly and friendly welcomed by members of the Bihać Rotary Club (District 1910). Their hospitality and openness created an atmosphere of true Rotarian spirit. Together we visited the natural jewels Štrbački buk and Martin Brod, and the visit to the Rmanj monastery added a spiritual and cultural-historical dimension to our stay.

We were especially inspired by the presentation of the ecological action of RC Bihać - "Rotary Canyon", through which the hosts emphasized the importance of preserving natural resources and the role of Rotarians in environmental protection. 4. April 12, 2025 Second Rotary Convention on Mental Health, District 2483 Mental Health Committee

Organized by the Mental Health Committee of District 2483 I of the Budva Rotary Club, the 2nd Convention on Mental Health was held at the Montenegro Hotel in Bečići, entitled "Empathy - the way to a better society".

This year's convention theme was not chosen by chance. Empathy is the essence of humanity, the foundation of any healthy society and the core value on which Rotary rests. Without it, there is no understanding, no support, no true community. At a time when social, family and interpersonal ties are increasingly weak, it is our responsibility to cultivate solidarity, compassion and a willingness to be there for each other.

The event was officially opened by Vladan Mijailović, Governor of District 2483 in 2024/25, Dr. Tijana Antin Pavlović, president of the Committee for Mental Health, Dr. Jovo Đedović in front of the organizing committee and Mirko Radjenović, president of the Rotary Club of Budva.

As part of the convention, an inspiring panel discussion "The art of empathy" was held under the excellent moderation of Dr. Jov Đedović, a psychiatrist from RC Budva. Gordana Nišević-Tadić, lawyer, RC Novi Sad Eco Art, Dr. Tijana Antin Pavlović, child and adolescent psychiatrist, RC Belgrade Sava, Darija Bambur-Petović, psychologist, RC Kotor and Anđela Ivanović, lawyer, RC Budva gave their contribution in considering the importance of empathy in different spheres of life. Participants presented the importance of empathy, not only in healthcare, but also in other professions, such as law and working with clients. As important as it is that empathy exists, it is just as important that it does not paralyze, but rather triggers action and adequate assistance to a client who has come to a lawyer or a patient who has consulted a doctor.

Special attention was drawn by Dr. Gorica Đokić's plenary lecture on "Narcissistic and Borderline Personality Disorders", which, through a professional but accessible approach, brought the complexity of mental challenges and the importance of an empathetic response closer to those present, led all those present to think and opened an interesting discussion about empathy in everyday life and leadership.

In the workshop part of the program, participants had the opportunity to actively participate in three workshops:

"Empathy in the health system", led by Dr. Olivere Poček, general medicine specialist, RC Ulcinj and Dr. Sanja Đedović, radiologist, DZ Budva. The presence and authentic experience of empathy on the part of a patient who has struggled for many years and continues to struggle with the difficult challenges of illness and disability gave the workshop a special richness. With her presence and authentic story, she pointed out the importance of the connection between courage and empathy and brought into the discussion the importance of the doctor's relationship with the patient and the way empathy is combined with the doctor's determination to help the patient.

Through the discussion, it was shown how much empathy within the club can be important for an individual - a member who is in a difficult phase of life.

"Empathy of the Rotary community towards society", with moderators Božena Jelušić, MD, prof. of Literature, RC Budva and M.Sc. Velibor Zolak, RC Budva. The workshop provided an opportunity to think through various examples about the importance of the Rotary Club's capacity for empathy towards the community, and how much empathy helps in deciding whom to help and in what way.

These workshops opened up space for reflection on how much and how we cultivate empathy within our communities and organizations, as well as on the broader implications for society as a whole.

The convention showed how necessary it is to talk about empathy not only as a feeling, but also as a skill that can be learned and nurtured. In an atmosphere of mutual respect, openness and honest exchange of experiences, the participants expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to participate in this innovative and necessary event. There was a strong sense of connection and a willingness to go further — to communities that care, listen and support.

The Mental Health Committee prepared this Convention for many months and with great care and reaffirmed that commitment to mental health is of particular importance at the moment in which we live and act as a Rotary community.

The first street library was installed on May 22, 2025, as part of the EUCO Belgrade event, in the beautiful surroundings of the "Jevremovac" Botanical Garden. This library is now available to all garden visitors, who can freely borrow or exchange books and thus additionally enrich their time spent in this peaceful corner of Belgrade.

The street libraries project aims to promote reading culture, togetherness and accessibility of books to everyone, regardless of age and education. Street libraries function according to the principle "take a book - leave a book", which encourages exchange and love for the written word.

In the coming period, two more libraries are planned to be installed, which will give this project an even wider social significance.

After the municipal and district reviews of the "Knowledge for the Future" festival in Belgrade, the festival final was held on May 19, 2025, at the "Ranko Žeravica" Sports Hall in New Belgrade, in which 64 schools with 91 teams participated in the drone, mbot robot 1 and mbot robot 2 disciplines. Over 400 students and teachers had the opportunity to show what they had learned together in programming and controlling mbot robots and drones.

After the singing of the anthem of the Republic of Serbia, the festival coordinator, Past Governor of Rotary District 2483 Vladimir Matić, greeted the students, teachers and guests present. He especially thanked the Ministry of Education of the Republic of Serbia as the patron of the festival and the City Municipality of Novi Belgrade, which was the sponsor of the final competition in the "Ranko Žeravica" Sports Hall again this year.

Matić also thanked all the friends who helped organize the festival, especially the "Klett" Publishing House, the companies "MikroElektronika" DOO Belgrade (Zemun), "Jaffa" Biscuit Factory Crvenka, "Swisslion-Takovo Gornji Milanovac, Rotary District 2483 of Serbia and Montenegro, the Red Cross Čukarice, the "Zvezda" Center and the hosts from the Commercial Company Sports Center Novi Belgrade d.o.o.


