XVIII Annual Conference of District 2482 – Bulgaria June 13–14, 2025

From Tradition to the Future, from Education to Change

There are moments that transcend the formal meaning of the word "event" and become something more—a symbol of identity, continuity, and community spirit. Such was the spirit that filled the XVIII Annual District Conference of District 2482 – Bulgaria, held on June 13–14, 2025, in Plovdiv—the city where, exactly eighteen years ago, the independent journey of Bulgarian Rotarians began.

A Return to the Beginning – Symbolism and History

Our gathering in Plovdiv was more than just a conference. It was a symbolic return to our roots, to the place where our independent path as Rotarians in Bulgaria first began. In the symbolism of this "coming of age" for our District, all the lessons, successes, and challenges we've shared over the years seemed to converge.

The hospitality of the hosts from the Rotary Clubs of Plovdiv brought warmth and a welcoming atmosphere to the event. The organized tour of the Episcopal Basilica revealed astonishing evidence of the historical significance of the city and the craftsmanship of our ancient ancestors.

A key moment of the conference was the welcome address by Past District Governor Nasko Nachev—the first leader of our independent district. Through his words, we returned to the foundations, to the values and ideals with which we began this journey. The school of the pioneers is the school of courage, inspiration, and ambition. In his speech, we found both memories and the confidence of people who are part of something meaningful—something greater than ourselves.





From Reflection to Vision - Messages from the District Governors

In her speech, **District Governor Margarita Bogdanova** delivered an emotional reflection on the past year, sharing the achievements and difficulties, the successes and challenges we faced. It was proudly noted that this year we managed to reverse the trend regarding membership and contributions to The Rotary Foundation. This success is the result of the collective efforts of the clubs and their commitment to change and sustainability. The role of the District team is to support the clubs in these efforts.

Plamen Tsvetkov, District Governor-Elect, succeeded in just a few short minutes in summarizing the key priorities for the upcoming Rotary year and emphasizing the vital importance of continuity. For it is continuity that serves as the invisible bridge linking the past to the future, experience to fresh ideas.





Special Guest and Inspiration

A truly moving moment was the presence of one of our special guests—Bulgarian writer and translator **Zdravka Evtimova**. With her charismatic personality and captivating style, she transformed the traditional discussion into a genuine talk show. Ms. Evtimova's sense of humor and storytelling talent brought genuine smiles to the audience. The heartfelt conversation on the topic "The Price of Change Within Ourselves" was exactly what we needed—an emotional catalyst that awakened an even stronger sense of community and responsibility.



Addictions – A Challenge of Our Time

One of the most important discussions at the conference addressed the painful topic of addictions. Guest speaker Dr. Boris Tablov and moderator PDG Valentin Stoyanov directed our focus toward the future—toward the young people who follow in our footsteps. The key questions raised—Is there an antidote to addiction? What is the role of society and families?—engaged the audience in a deep and meaningful conversation.

Galya Pencheva from Rotary club Ruse-Dunav expanded on the topic with her presentation "Goodness Dealers in Action," offering a Rotary perspective and highlighting specific initiatives.

Arkan Nihat from Rotary club Kardzhali and ARPIC in the Zone 21B team for our District shared the positive emotions surrounding Paradise Cup 2025—a traditional football tournament that will become an international initiative starting next year. Sport educates and is one of the most effective tools for addiction prevention.

Konstantin Stoyanov from Rotary club Stara Zagora presented the initiative "Looking Toward Crisis Response – Let's Prepare the Next Generation!" The Disaster Preparedness, Fire Safety, and Emergency Response Competition gives students the chance to showcase and develop skills that will help them respond effectively in real crisis situations. With modernized equipment and strong emotional impact, the event left a lasting impression and instilled in the young participants a sense of responsibility and readiness to help.

We believe that this kind of support not only builds leaders and protectors of tomorrow, but also strengthens our faith in the next generation's ability to face every challenge with courage and preparedness.







A team of three **Rotaractors from Rotaract club Sofia** presented a project focused on the creation and release of the **podcast series "Emotions Unmasked – The Voice of Youth."** The project, in partnership with the Academy for Emotional Intelligence, features honest conversations about the emotional and psychological challenges faced by young people. Three full episodes have been recorded and published on YouTube, along with nine short videos shared across social media platforms.

A particularly emotional moment came with the announcement of the results from the "Choose Freedom!" contest, personally chaired by DG Margarita Bogdanova. The young participants demonstrated how art can be a powerful tool for prevention and change, and their works touched and moved everyone present.

Club Projects - Education as the Key to Change

The highlight of the conference was the panel "Education with Vision: From Curiosity to Science." Education stood at the center of attention, with several inspiring initiatives showcased. Mathematics was emphasized as fundamental to modern STEM approaches—as a language that fosters critical, free, and analytical thinking.

The **clubs from Asenovgrad**, **Burgas**, **and Chirpan** proudly presented their math competitions and tournaments. The Asenovgrad Math Tournament "Academic Blagovest Sendov"—even though our friends couldn't join this year—was noted as a significant tradition.

Ivan Stanchev from Rotary club Chirpan presented a student competition organized in his city.

Gergana Georgieva from Rotary club Burgas highlighted the major success of their mathematics and applied mathematics competition, which evolved into an international initiative as early as this year. These projects prove that when children are engaged in intellectual and creative activities, it is one of the most effective and meaningful ways to prevent addiction and other negative influences.









The "Purple Feather" Project by Rotaract Club Sofia Vitosha was presented by Nevena Ivanova, DRR-Elect. This year, the traditional creative writing contest is divided into two age groups: 14–18 and 18–30 years old, with each group competing in two categories—prose and poetry. The mission of the contest is to encourage young people to create with purpose and to stand up for their beliefs. The final stage of the competition will take place at the end of June, with a qualified jury of three writers evaluating the young authors' works.

In addition to mathematics, the project "Little Gardeners – Friends of the Plants" by Rotary club Dupnitsa, presented by Metodi Dimitrov, as well as the presentation of the Rotary Knowledge Center by Rositsa Mihaylova (Rotary club Shumen), added depth and value to the panel—demonstrating how diverse forms of education and hands-on engagement can lead to real and lasting change.

A Look Toward the Future and World Peace

A touching and engaging presentation was delivered by **Angela Antonova—a Rotary Peace Fellow at the Rotary Peace Center in Istanbul.** The topic of peace, always relevant, took on special significance in light of current events unfolding close to home—raising issues of war, security challenges, and the urgent need to seek paths to peace and mutual understanding.





The conference concluded with the presentation of the **biographical book about Sabo Nikolov** and a brief meeting with the future leaders of the district. This ending symbolically closed the circle—from the past, through the present, toward the future.

The XVIII Annual Conference of District 2482 was a celebration of community, education, and a shared vision for a better future. It clearly demonstrated that change begins with us—with the willingness to embrace challenges, to inspire, and to work together—today, tomorrow, and always.













The 2025 Rotary International Convention, held 21–25 June in Calgary, Alberta, concluded with resounding success, leaving participants energized, inspired, and united under the convention's fitting theme: Magic All Around. Thousands of Rotarians from across the globe gathered in the heart of Canada's west to celebrate service, fellowship, and the shared vision of building a more peaceful and equitable world.

From the very beginning, the convention embodied the vibrant spirit of Rotary. Rotary International President Stephanie A. Urchick opened the event with a jubilant "Yahoo!" — a nod to Calgary's rich rodeo culture — while emphasizing that beneath the festive atmosphere lay a powerful commitment to service and purpose. "Rotary works because we belong here," Urchick said, reinforcing the message that Rotary's greatest strength lies in the relationships among its members.

Throughout the five-day program, attendees engaged in an array of plenary sessions, breakout discussions, project showcases, and cultural performances. The House of Friendship served as the hub of connection and innovation, showcasing Rotary projects and partner initiatives from every region of the world.





Global Voices for Change

Distinguished keynote speakers delivered powerful messages on topics ranging from gender equality and health equity to climate justice and peacebuilding. Academy Award-winning actor and advocate Geena Davis challenged societal norms with a passionate talk on representation of women and girls in media. Nobel Peace Laureate Tawakkol Karman inspired attendees with her personal journey as a journalist and human rights defender in Yemen, while Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, Director-General of the World Health Organization, reiterated his steadfast commitment to global health and polio eradication.



Other notable speakers included NPR journalist Scott Simon, climate scientist Katharine Hayhoe, behavioral health expert Isabel Scarinci, and peacebuilder and musician David LaMotte. Their thought-provoking contributions resonated deeply with Rotary's mission to address complex global challenges through community-led action.

A Renewed Commitment to End Polio

A major highlight of the convention was the announcement of a renewed partnership between Rotary and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, with a joint commitment of up to US\$450 million over the next three years to support the final push to eradicate polio. Bill Gates addressed attendees via video, calling this a defining moment: "We are at a crossroads. The next few years are critical. With your continued commitment, we can end polio once and for all."

Peace and Programs of Scale

Rotary also unveiled its fifth Programs of Scale grant — a US\$2 million investment in partnership with the UN World Food Programme to promote peace and prosperity in conflict-affected regions of Colombia. The initiative will expand access to economic opportunity, strengthen conflict resolution capacity, and promote sustainable peacebuilding at the community level.





In a landmark moment, RI President Stephanie Urchick also announced the establishment of a new Rotary Peace Center at Symbiosis International University in Pune, India, expanding the global network of peacebuilders who are trained to create lasting change across sectors and borders. Learning, Inspiration, and Fellowship

Dozens of breakout sessions provided attendees with practical tools and inspiration to enhance their impact.





Sessions such as The Amazing Peace Race explored how clubs can integrate Rotary's Eight Pillars of Positive Peace into local and global initiatives. Literacy Alive showcased literacy efforts in Belize, and the Rotary Action Group Against Slavery spotlighted its advocacy against human trafficking, featuring Nobel Peace Prize nominee Cheryl Perera's extraordinary story.

Exhibits in the House of Friendship included a 20-foot tipi sponsored by Rotary District 5360, honoring Indigenous cultures and promoting inclusive service. After-hours events, including a Grandstand Spectacular and a performance of New Blood — blending Blackfoot traditions with modern music — offered unforgettable cultural experiences, reinforcing the message that fellowship and service go hand in hand.

Celebrating Progress and Looking Ahead

In his address to the third general session, The Rotary Foundation Chair and Past RI President Mark Daniel Maloney celebrated a major milestone: the Foundation's Endowment Fund surpassing US\$2 billion, a testament to Rotarians' generosity and long-term commitment to sustainable impact.









Incoming RI President Francesco Arezzo took the stage to share his vision for 2025–26 under the theme "Unite for Good", calling on clubs to collaborate more deeply with partners, communities, and one another. "Let us create one great shared dream," he said, "one that unites us, excites us, and changes the world — and our lives."

As the convention drew to a close, the sense of global fellowship remained strong. Committee Chair Bryn Styles reflected on the overwhelming positive response from participants. "People love Calgary — and they love what Rotary represents."

Looking ahead, attendees were invited to mark their calendars for the 2026 Rotary International Convention in Taipei, Taiwan, promising yet another unforgettable gathering of People of Action committed to creating hope and advancing peace.
















RC NICOSIA ASPELIA PRESIDENCY 2024-25 NAIRY MERHEJE









RID 2475 - RC DIONYSOS


A pleasant surprise was the presence of assistant DG Anastasia Kryona from RC Chrysoupolis Nestos River, old friend of RC Kerkyra.

The video reports, broadcast on MG Media's YouTube channel, gathered hundreds of views within just a few hours.

EUCO Belgrade 2025 – Serbia at the Heart of Europe

This year, District 2483 Serbia & Montenegro had the extraordinary honor of hosting the largest European Rotaract conference – EUCO Belgrade 2025. The event brought together more than 300 participants from over 40 countries worldwide, celebrating international fellowship, service, and cultural exchange in the heart of Belgrade.

The conference was organized by Rotaract Club Belgrade Dedinje, District 2483, and offered a rich program that blended impactful service, vibrant social events, and the true spirit of Rotaract.

In addition to unforgettable fellowship and networking opportunities, EUCO Belgrade 2025 featured several meaningful social projects:

- 1.The EUCO Library, established in the Belgrade Botanical Garden in cooperation with Rotary Club Belgrade Metropolitan, was created from books brought by participants from their home countries in various languages as a symbol of cultural exchange and international friendship.
- 2.Participants also had the opportunity to take part in the "Present Your Business" session a platform designed to encourage professional networking among Rotaractors, where they could promote themselves, share their ideas, and showcase entrepreneurial or career projects with an international audience.
- 3.The Rotaract Charity Fashion Show, a traditional event organized by Rotaract Club Belgrade Singidunum, combined elegance with purpose. What made this fashion show truly special was that the models were Rotaractors from different countries around the world. All proceeds were donated to the organization "Dečje Srce" in Serbia.
- 4.The RotaRun, a traditional humanitarian run organized by Rotaract Club Novi Sad, gathered participants in support of a noble cause.
- 5.One of the truly special highlights of the conference, alongside the full program, was the Country Booths Night an event where participants brought traditional food and drinks from their home countries, creating a vibrant fair that celebrated the diversity and culture of all represented nations.

The main social project of EUCO Belgrade, "Walking with Blind and Visually Impaired People", was designed to raise awareness about the everyday challenges faced by blind and visually impaired individuals. As part of the initiative, €1,000 was donated for the purchase of glucose monitoring sensors that provide real-time blood sugar updates via a mobile app, helping blind and visually impaired people to manage their health more easily and independently.


