

Rotary's July Theme: Maternal and Child Health Month

As the Rotary year begins in July, Rotary International highlights one of its core Areas of Focus: Maternal and Child Health. This theme underscores the critical need to improve access to quality care for mothers and children around the world, particularly in vulnerable and underserved communities. Rotary's commitment to this cause is grounded in the belief that healthy mothers and children build stronger, more resilient communities.

The Global Challenge

Every year, approximately 295,000 women die from complications related to pregnancy and childbirth — most of them preventable. Additionally, over 5 million children under the age of five die annually from causes such as malnutrition, poor sanitation, and lack of access to medical care. These tragedies often occur in regions with limited healthcare infrastructure and resources.

These numbers reflect not only a health crisis but a humanitarian one. Behind every statistic is a mother who won't return home and a child who will never grow up. The need for sustained, community-based solutions has never been more urgent — and that is where Rotary steps in.

Rotary's Impact

Rotary clubs around the world take action by supporting innovative, sustainable projects that address maternal and child health. These projects focus on prevention, treatment, education, and empowerment — all key factors in reducing mortality rates and improving overall well-being.

Examples of Rotary-led initiatives include:

- Maternal Waiting Homes: These safe residences near hospitals allow expectant mothers in remote areas to stay close to medical care as their due dates approach.
- **Mobile Health Clinics:** Rotary sponsors clinics that bring prenatal care, immunizations, and basic medical services to rural and hard-to-reach populations.
- Midwife and Healthcare Worker Training: Investing in the education and training of birth attendants ensures safer deliveries and better maternal outcomes.
- **Nutrition and Hygiene Education:** Many Rotary clubs implement programs to teach families about breastfeeding, child nutrition, sanitation, and disease prevention.
- Water and Sanitation (WASH): By improving access to clean water and sanitary facilities, Rotary helps prevent infections that often harm mothers and children during and after childbirth.

Collaboration for Greater Reach

Rotary works alongside global health organizations such as the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and national health ministries to amplify the impact of these initiatives. Through Rotary Foundation Global Grants, clubs can expand their reach and implement larger, more effective programs.

A Lasting Commitment

By dedicating July to Maternal and Child Health, Rotary reaffirms its dedication to saving lives and creating healthier futures. It's a reminder that every woman deserves a safe pregnancy and every child deserves a strong start in life. Through service, compassion, and collaboration, Rotarians help make that vision a reality — one mother and one child at a time.

Francesco Arezzo is an orthodontist in private practice and owns an agricultural enterprise that produces extra virgin olive oil in Sicily.



LARRY A. LUNSFORD SELECTED TO BE 2027-28 ROTARY INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT

Larry A. Lunsford, a member of the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza, Missouri, USA, is the selection of the nominating committee to become Rotary International's president for 2027-28. He will officially become the president-nominee on 15 September if no other candidates challenge him.

Lunsford attended Truman State University in Kirksville, Missouri, on an academic scholarship, earning bachelor's and master's degrees in accounting. He first encountered Rotary when he received a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship to spend the 1981-82 academic year at the University of Newcastle in Australia.

A certified public accountant, Lunsford spent seven years working for Ernst & Young before joining a family-owned business, Bernstein-Rein Advertising, in 1990. He is currently executive vice president and chief financial officer for the Bernstein group of companies. He has held positions on the boards of the Kansas City Spirit Festival and the Variety Club as well as serving as director of a local bank and treasurer of the Epilepsy Foundation for the Heart of America. He has also served on Truman State University's alumni and foundation boards and received the university's Distinguished Service Award.

Lunsford joined the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza in 1991 and has since served as district governor (2001-02), RI director (2013-15), and trustee of The Rotary Foundation (2021-25, vice chair 2024-25). He has been a member of RI committees, including the Executive Committee (chair 2014-15), Membership Growth Committee (chair 2016-18), and Nominating Committee for President of RI (chair 2023-24). He also has served on The Rotary Foundation's Executive Committee (chair 2023-24), Finance Committee (chair 2022-23 and 2024-25), and Participant Experience Committee (chair 2023-24).

Lunsford has been awarded The Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award, The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service, and the RI Service Above Self Award. He and his wife, Jill Lunsford, have two children and one grandchild. They are Major Donors, Bequest Society members, multiple Paul Harris Fellows, Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation, and Sustaining Members.

A Time to Grow and Strengthen Our Rotary Family

As we all know, August is a special month in the Rotary calendar which one where we focus on membership. It's a time to not only welcome new members into our clubs, but also to develop strategies that help us retain the valuable members we already have.

Our data tells us that attracting new members isn't our biggest challenge especially in our region. What's more concerning is how quickly many of these new members leave in first three years. This highlights an area we cannot afford to ignore: ensuring that new members feel truly connected, engaged, and inspired to stay.

Another area where we fall short is transforming the strong relationships we build through our youth programs into long-term membership. Programs like RYLA and Youth Exchange are life changing for young people and their families. All of them are left with unforgettable, positive impressions. Yet, we rarely succeed in bringing these alumni or even their parents into the Rotary family as members. The same is true for our dedicated Rotaractors, many of whom lose their connection to Rotary after leaving Rotaract, despite having been part of our family for years.

These are realities we must face. And they call for clear, creative strategies but not only to reduce member attrition, but also to strengthen our efforts to engage alumni communities in meaningful ways.

Rotary was founded on the principle of vocational diversity. Though we don't emphasize this aspect as strongly today, it remains a powerful tool. Clubs that review their classification lists and seek out professionals in underrepresented fields open doors to growth, fresh perspectives, and greater service capacity.

Another vital strategy for membership growth is the formation of new clubs. Across our regions, there are still many communities where a Rotary club is needed. Strategic mapping can help us identify these areas and take action. After all, new clubs don't just expand Rotary also they make us more accessible, more diverse, and more connected.

Fortunately, Rotary has embraced flexible club models that make growth easier and more attractive. Today, clubs can meet virtually, focus on shared interests or professions, operate within companies, or suit the lifestyles of people who travel often. These alternative models respond to the changing needs of our world and to the preferences of potential members.

Traditional Rotary and Rotaract clubs will always have their place. But satellite clubs offer something new: a way for existing clubs to grow organically, or to welcome candidates who may not quite fit into current structures. This model holds tremendous potential for expansion and inclusion.

In the end, growth means reaching more people, building stronger communities, and spreading Rotary's spirit of service even further. It's about making the world more compassionate, more connected, and more hopeful.

That's why we must confidently and sincerely share Rotary's values with people who haven't yet heard of us, especially professionals of integrity who want to give back to society. We must help them understand a simple, powerful truth:

"He profits most who serves best."

And let's not stop with our own clubs, let's support membership growth in neighboring clubs, too.

Because now, more than ever: It's time to Unite for Good.


- Crafting an ideal future Rotarian through artificial intelligence,

On the morning of February 6, 2023, Türkiye was shaken by one of the most devastating disasters in its history. This massive earthquake destroyed not only cities but also the lives and dreams of thousands of people. But we know that some people rise from the ruins and not only survive but also rebuild that entire life. Tutku, one of our daughter Tutku... One of them...





In 2000, Tutku was born in Hatay where cannot survive as it once did. With her technical curiosity and passion for creating solutions, Tutku took part in multifaceted projects ranging from artificial intelligence to cyber security, from machine learning to data science, and graduated from Çukurova University, Department of Computer Engineering with honors.

In addition to her academic achievements, what made Tutku different and carried her beyond science and knowledge was her belief in learning and producing, despite the traumatic personal losses she experienced. On February 6, she lost her home and, along with it, her greatest treasure, her father. That day, when she believed she would not be able to bear the burden she was carrying after this great loss, she came across a Rotary 2023-2024 term project that gave her hope.

In 2024, the University of Bradford, through the British Council, announced that it would provide scholarships to five female students from Turkey to continue their engineering studies and research. The scholarship covers tuition fees, living expenses, transport, visa costs and insurance, amounting to approximately £250,000 per student.

Harika Eryılmaz, President of the Mersin Rotary Scholarship and Scholarship Committee, reached out to all regional scholarship recipients, listed the eligible candidates, contacted Dr. Behruz Khaghani, who wrote the project and followed the process closely. As a result, six of our candidates were interviewed, and three of our candidates were selected to receive this scholarship and were invited by the University of Bradford.





Despite all these challenges, Tutku, who has won this prestigious scholarship, one of the few female students to have won, is about to graduate with distinct in the field of "Applied Artificial Intelligence and Data Analytics". This month, the 2023-2024 Term President, Rujdan Doğan, and his board visited Tutku in England.

The Point where Labor and Passion

Today, as she counts down the days to her master's degree, Tutku has also been awarded the "Higher Education Achievement Report" award by her university. She is a bright young woman who has focused not only on individual progress but also on creating social benefit throughout her education.

Tutku, who took part in visualization projects on sunspots and solar storms with researchers working with NASA, also conveyed meaningful messages to both Turkey and the world with interactive mapping projects that illustrate the pain of earthquakes with data.

All these studies reveal not only Tutku's academic potential but also her ethical and social sensitivity. Her vision is not just to produce technology, but to direct science for the benefit of humanity. For this reason, after completing her master's degree, she plans to continue her doctoral research on the ethical, legal and social dimensions of artificial intelligence applications. She states that she wants to work in collaboration with academic institutions and industrial structures that strengthen the interaction between technology and policy in the future and that she is open to professional and academic opportunities from all over the world, and conveys the following message to all Rotarians in the world:

We are pleased to introduce you Archaeo-Camp 2025, a joint project of Aspendos Rotary Club and Kaleiçi Rotary Club, our first Thematic Short Term Camp in Türkiye, Antalya, Demre. Arkeo-Camp 2025 Turkey, the first Thematic Short Term Camp in Antalya, Demre, which is a joint project of Aspendos Rotary Club and Kaleiçi Rotary Club; It was held in Demre district of Antalya between 5-12 July 2025. Rotary sponsored 3 participants, 1 archaeologist camp coordinator, 6 field visits, 2 workshops with participants from all over Turkey and Europe.

During the camp, the aim was to introduce the archaeological and cultural heritage of Turkey and Antalya and to give foreign students the experience of archaeological excavation. During the weeklong camp, activities such as inventorying, documenting, ceramic washing and clay ceramic making workshops in the excavation house, as well as field photography in the field, field photography with drone, observation of excavation works were carried out. At the same time, tastings and food activities were organised in order to experience different local flavours such as meatballs-piyaz and baked goods made from heirloom seeds, which are unique to Antalya.

Apart from archaeological field trips, Kekova Sunken City, Elmalı Region Stone Houses and Kaş, where natural and cultural beauties are together, were visited. Archaeological sites such as Myra and Andriake Excavations, Patara Excavations and St. Nicholas Church were visited and archaeological heritage studies were experienced in the field. At the same time, Antalya Kaleiçi Rotaract Club and Aspendos Rotaract Club members accompanied our participants during all these visits. During the environmental cleaning of Çayağzı Beach, environmental cleaning activities and Caretta Caretta Detection Studies were carried out together with LIDOSK and Erasmus+ Students. At the end of the event, all participants returned home happy and with an archaeological experience. Thank you for being a part of our Archaeology Camp Journey.

Being able to touch the lives of these guest children, showcase our culture in the best way, make new friendships, and send them off happy gives us a special joy.


On the last day, seeing them hugging each other and crying brought us both sadness and happiness.

This year, in our summer camp, we hosted a total of 14 students: 4 from Italy, 1 from Hungary, 2 from Spain, 1 from Croatia, 1 from Germany, 1 from Taiwan, 2 from France, 1 from Austria, and 1 from the Czech Republic. Among them, there were 9 boys and 5 girls. We, together with Toros Rotary Club and Eskişehir Yazılıkaya Rotary Club, organized the camp.

Within the scope of the project, we were in Mersin from July 12th to 19th, 2025, and in Eskişehir from July 19th to 26th, 2025. In Mersin, the beginning of our camp, we visited Cennet Cehennem Cave, shared moments with families at Mersin Marina, and enjoyed pool and seaside activities. We also had picnics and took part in historical tours in Tarsus. We extend special thanks for the support from the Mediterranean, Olba, and Mersin Kızkalesi Rotary Clubs during the Mersin part of the camp.

After Mersin, we moved to Cappadocia to meet with our host club, Eskişehir Yazılıkaya Rotary Club. There, we held a joint meeting with Cappadocia Rotary Club and conducted a flag exchange ceremony.

During this project, Eskişehir Anadolu Rotary Club supported the accommodation of 1 student, Eskişehir Rotary Club supported 1 student, and Gordion Rotary Club supported 1 student in Eskişehir, totaling 3 students receiving accommodation support. Additionally, Ankara Anıttepe Rotary Club supported the children when they arrived at the airport. Moreover, throughout the Eskişehir and Seyitgazi programs, students from Eskişehir Rotary Club and Eskişehir Yazılıkaya Rotaract Club continuously supported and cared for the children.

My heartfelt thanks to the members of my Club for their sensitivity and their direct contribution to this action.






RID 2475 - RC VOULA PANORAMA

Rotary Club Bourgas Sunny Tales by the Sea After a Snowy Beginning




It all began on a snowy day in Istanbul – a day as remarkable as the rare weather phenomenon itself in this part of the world. The decision of two clubs – Rotary Club Bodrum from District 2440 and Rotary Club Bourgas from District 2482 – to send their representatives to the Rotary Peace Conference and the Intercountry Committees (ICC) meeting in Istanbul marked the beginning of a beautiful friendship. Thanks to the efforts of the Rotarians in Turkey, Istanbul truly deserved the honor of hosting these forums. Bahcesehir University (BAU) became the latest Rotary Peace Center – this time just a few hours' drive from us. This opens up a new opportunity for District 2482 to send fellows to the Rotary International Peace Fellowships program (see more at: rotary.org/peace-fellowships).

And although it's not very Rotarian to say so, it was the smoking corner at BAU that turned out to be the first social platform for sophisticated interclub communication. What followed was a walk through the university halls, a conversation about a project to support women from regions affected by the major earthquake in Turkey, and a decision – completely spontaneous and entirely logical – to sign a preliminary twinning agreement. And, as often happens, good news travels fast: the very next day, the preliminary document was officially signed – in the presence of Zone 21 and 22 Director Daniel Tanase, Regional Public Image Coordinator PDG Altan Aslan, and District 2440 Governor Mert Korur.

Offer a Hand, Not Aggression

Knives in backpacks. Fights in the bathrooms. Words that cut deeper than fists.

Too often now, the headlines tell of children hurting other children. Of classrooms filled with silence that screams. Of teachers unsure where to begin. Of parents who learn of the violence only when it's too late.

School aggression is no longer an isolated "incident." It is a symptom of a system in distress—a society that has grown numb to the fear in a child's eyes.

The project "Extend a Hand, Not Aggression" was born from this pain—but also from a place of hope.

Hope that we can restore trust. That we can build a new language—one of empathy instead of insults. That we can create safe spaces where every child feels protected, heard, and accepted.

What have we achieved so far?

Together with a team of psychologists and educators, we developed a therapeutic board game designed to support children who have experienced or witnessed violence and bullying in schools. The game was piloted in a protected and controlled environment, with the involvement of professionals and strict adherence to confidentiality and ethical standards.

This gave us valuable insights—and the confidence that we are approaching the issue with the necessary care, sensitivity, and professionalism.

What's next?

Our next step is to move beyond the protected setting and bring this tool into real school environments—guided by trained facilitators, dedicated teams, and a clear support framework.

Why is this project different?

Because it doesn't look for someone to blame. It looks for understanding. For solutions.

It works not only with the children who have been hurt, but also with those who have shown aggression, with the bystanders, and with the ones who want to help but don't know how.

"Extend a Hand, Not Aggression" is not just a project—it's a stance. A call to action. An outstretched hand—not only to children, but to every adult willing to reflect, to change, and to be part of the solution.

What lies ahead?

We're not stopping here. We believe in the impact we've already made—but we know more is needed.

We dream of expanding the project: reaching new schools and communities, training new teams, and providing access to tools and knowledge where there have been none.

If you believe that every child deserves a safe and secure childhood...

If you believe that empathy can be taught, and that kindness is not a weakness but a strength— Join our network.

Because change starts with one conversation.

With one hand, extended.

This project is implemented as part of INSPIRE: Enhancing national support for the prevention, intervention, and response to violence against children, and empowering victims—co-funded by the European Union and the Workshop for Civic Initiatives Foundation (WCIF).

Together, we are changing lives for the better.





The Magic Rotary year served as a special inspiration for the District Action of RD2483. Guided by the idea of the Rotary Climate Ambassador, the Rotary Club Novi Sad Eco-Art, in collaboration with the Rotaract Climate Action Task Force, continued its Climate Action with new ideas and activities, building on the achievements of the IMAGINE and HOPE initiatives, and honoring the importance of continuity in the Rotary community.

We organized five webinars dedicated to various topics related to Climate Action, including motivation, collaboration with Rotaract, cooperation with ESRAG, the importance of global climate efforts, and our local opportunities within the community.

We invited Rotary clubs in the District that had not yet participated to join us. The RC Belgrade International, RC Belgrade Technology, Rotary Club Novi Sad, and RC Mihajlo Pupin responded to our call. In addition, the Rotary Club Osijek Academia RD1913, with which the Rotary Club Eco-Art Novi Sad has a twinning and cooperation agreement, joined our Climate Action. We have more than 120 individual declarations and over 30 clubs that have joined the Climate Action initiative so far.

In February 2025, we held a Rotary Training Day dedicated to Climate Action, open to all interested members of Rotary and Rotaract. 




