

#### **What Community-Led Development Looks Like**

October is the month when Rotary focuses its attention on building prosperous and sustainable communities. It is also a time that perfectly reflects one of Rotary's core values – leadership.

To be a leader means to inspire and empower others to take charge of their own progress. This is at the heart of Rotary's economic development projects.

A powerful example of this can be found in southern India, where Rotarians helped women from the Adivasi tribe acquire sewing skills so they could earn a living and regain their place in society. Historically, widowed or abandoned women in this region have lost their social status and were often rejected or blamed for their misfortunes. Opportunities for work or education were extremely limited.

This year, the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, partnered with clubs from Districts 3203 and 3234 in India and with the Indian organisation Sevalaya Trust to provide sewing machines and training for 80 Adivasi women. The participants learned to make traditional Indian garments – sari blouses, kurtis, and salwar suits – and in doing so, they gained the ability to support themselves and their families.

Each woman received a certificate of completion, and the machine supplier committed to providing free long-term maintenance.

The project brought not only income but also dignity to women who had previously been marginalised. This is Rotary leadership in action – when local people find their own solutions to their needs, and we stand beside them in support. Our role is not merely to donate or impose outside models, but to encourage self-reliance, skills development, and sustainable entrepreneurship.

This October, I invite all Rotarians around the world to reflect on economic leadership within their own communities:

- Who is taking the initiative for local economic development?
- Where might there be hidden talents that could be nurtured through training or mentorship?
- How can your club create new opportunities through partnerships with local businesses, vocational schools, or savings groups?

Leadership does not always mean being at the forefront. Sometimes it is found in listening, in working side by side, and in amplifying the voices of others. This approach lies at the very heart of Rotary's philosophy and underpins our lasting impact on community development.

By building capacity – whether through microcredit groups, vocational training, or entrepreneurial programmes – we enable people to shape their own futures. When communities take ownership of their own development, change becomes sustainable. Let us lead with good intentions and support with open hearts. The friendship between Susanne and Pressy led to the joining of their clubs. And this October, as Rotary observes Economic and Community Development Month, I thought it best for Pressy Babalola herself to share, in her own words, the impact of their collaboration:

"Obuama, Nigeria, was severely affected by COVID-19. Many families – especially women and young people – were left without stable income or opportunities. The community urgently needed practical support and long-term solutions.

My club, the Rotary Club of Port Harcourt Passport, decided to take action. We partnered with the Rotary E-Club Hamburg-Connect and our districts to launch a global grant project aimed at empowering people with skills that restore hope and dignity.

Over 250 women and young adults were trained in fish farming, poultry farming, snail breeding, and bead making. Local trainers led hands-on workshops, equipping participants with the skills to start their own businesses. Families now have sources of income, and mothers can send their children to school. Young people are earning a living, training others, and contributing to the local economy.

Women who were once stagnant now run their own businesses, teach others, and have found new meaning and purpose. The project continues to grow, creating not just jobs, but confident leaders within the community."

# GUIDELINES FOR FILMING A VIDEO FOR COMPETITION "THE POWER OF GOODNESS"

#### 1. Plan the filming in advance.

As you prepare your project or event, decide who will be responsible for filming, what equipment will be used, and which shots will be needed. Assign a dedicated person or team for this task.

#### 2. Use a drone when possible.

For outdoor activities, aerial shots provide dynamics and add a professional look to the video.

#### 3. Include interviews.

Record short interviews with participants, volunteers, organizers, or beneficiaries. Ask what the project means to them, how it made them feel, or what inspired them.

#### 4. Tell a story, not just document.

Focus on emotions, action, and outcomes. Show people, not only activities.

#### 5. Capture the preparation phase.

Behind-the-scenes footage of volunteers packing, organizing, or coordinating creates authenticity and highlights the effort behind the cause.

#### 6. Gather short statements.

Even one or two sincere sentences from someone whose life has been touched can be very powerful. Seek authenticity rather than long monologues.

#### 7. Ensure good lighting.

Whether indoors or outdoors, light is essential. Avoid dark rooms or shooting directly against the sun.

#### 8. Use stable equipment.

Unsteady shots are distracting. If you don't have a professional camera, use a tripod or stabilizer for your phone.

#### 9. Film in horizontal format.

For higher quality and compatibility with platforms such as YouTube, always shoot horizontally.

#### 10. Include close-up shots.

Faces, smiles, and hands in action bring warmth and humanity to the story.

#### 11. Ensure clear sound.

Use an external microphone if possible. In noisy environments, consider recording separately or adding narration afterwards.

# GUIDELINES FOR FILMING A VIDEO FOR COMPETITION "THE POWER OF GOODNESS"

#### 12. Show the final result.

Present the completed project, the happy participants, and the overall impact achieved.

#### 13. Build a timeline through your shots.

Show "before, during, and after" the event. This structure helps tell a complete story.

#### 14. Capture audience reactions.

Smiles, applause, and emotions are living proof of the project's impact.

#### 15. Include children and youth (with consent).

If children are part of the initiative, ensure parental consent for filming. Their smiles often speak louder than words.

#### 16. Add supporting images or archives.

If your project has history, use "before and after" comparisons, documents, or older photos to show progress.

#### 17. Use music to enhance emotion.

Neutral, uplifting music reinforces the message. Make sure to use licensed tracks or free-to-use libraries.

#### 18. Add English subtitles, especially when people are speaking.

Even short statements should be subtitled to ensure clarity and accessibility.

#### 19. Display names and roles.

When showing someone speaking, add their name and role for context.

#### 20. Start and finish with identity elements.

Open with a short title/intro and close with your club's logo.

#### 21. Include a message or a quote.

A powerful line or inspiring quote at the end can leave a lasting emotional impression.

#### 22. Prepare a clear script before editing.

Decide what story you want to tell, in what sequence, and with which footage.

#### 23. Show the impact achieved.

Highlight how lives were improved or what was accomplished. This is the heart of the contest — the lasting mark of kindness.

#### 24. Respect Rotary branding.

Use the official Rotary logo, fonts, and colors. Guidelines are available at brandcenter.rotary.org.


A computer, kindly donated by the law firm "Margaropoulos and Associates," which warmly embraced our effort.



RC Rhodos supports the General Hospital Cardiology Clinic of Rhodes with state-of-the-art equipment

Faithful to its principles and values for over 63 years, the Rotary Club of Rhodes continues to serve the community with discretion, integrity, and respect, providing both moral and material support to individuals, institutions, and organizations.

On Monday, September 29, 2025, following consultation with the physicians in charge of the Cardiology Clinic, the Rotary Club of Rhodes donated a \*\*Philips Ultrasound Workstation\*\*, a modern system that fully meets the diagnostic and clinical needs of the Clinic.

This important donation significantly upgrades the Clinic's infrastructure and supports the work of its medical staff, as it allows them to digitally record, store, and access patients' ultrasound and other examination data over time. This enables them to review previous results when needed, analyze new data, compare findings, and carry out a range of procedures that enhance patient care.

The Ultrasound Workstation offers DICOM 3.0 bidirectional communication compatibility with all ultrasound units in the department, regardless of manufacturer. It provides reporting functionality for the performed studies and enables A4 color printing in Greek. The system includes a comprehensive structured reporting package for producing high-quality standardized echocardiography reports, as well as specialized software for storing and retrieving three-dimensional image studies or DICOM PDFs, and for categorizing patient files according to specific characteristics or medical conditions.

The system also offers remote technical and operational support via the internet, reducing the hospital's operating costs. It includes a computer with a DVD writer and a 23-inch monitor.

The effort to acquire and donate this workstation began two years ago under the presidency of loannis Chalikias, continued under Nikos Retsasand was successfully completed during the presidency of Beatriki-Kalliopi Servou.

Every form of leadership begins with a vision. It is the clear sense of direction you wish to pursue. A vision that remains only in your mind is merely a dream. To come to life, it must be shared and understood. People need to see themselves in it in order to walk the path together.

A leader knows how to communicate in a way that hears not only what is said but also what is left unspoken. They understand different perspectives and weave them into a shared understanding. When they speak, they do so with clarity and honesty—building trust and confidence.

Leadership is also the care for the growth of those around you. It is the ability to recognize potential and to create space for it to unfold. To encourage. To support. To step aside and share the spotlight when someone else is ready for it.

To be a leader means to walk with purpose and persistence, with a willingness to serve a cause greater than yourself. It is a continuous journey of learning—alongside the people who walk with you.

The greatest recognition comes in the moment they continue confidently—even without you.



#### 24.09.2025 - RC Zrenjanin: Donation of mBot robots and training for teachers

The Rotary Club of Zrenjanin has continued its support for global grants that have been implementing the project "Knowledge for the Future" for years. This year, as part of the activities, a visit was organized by Rotarians from the USA who are partners in these projects. As a central part of the visit on 24.09.2025, a ceremonial awarding of mBot robots for elementary schools in Zrenjanin and the surrounding area was organized, as part of the project "Knowledge for the Future". This initiative is being implemented in cooperation with the Rotary Club of Zrenjanin, the Rotary Club of Belgrade Čukarica and Rotary District 2483, and with the support of the City of Zrenjanin, the Ministry of Education and the Institute for the Advancement of Education. Those present were greeted by the President of the Rotary Club of Zrenjanin Siniša Pandurov, PDG Vladimir Matić, PDG Hamsa Thota on behalf of District 6920 Georgia / USA and the Mayor of Zrenjanin Simo Salapura. In this way, the donation takes on full meaning - because teachers become ready to transfer the acquired knowledge in a real environment and motivate students to develop creativity, critical thinking, logical reasoning and teamwork through robotic tasks. This is the fourth year in a row that the Rotary Club of Zrenjanin has been implementing this activity, which builds continuity and strengthens the foundations of modern education in the local community. The results so far show that students are interested in such programs, and teachers emphasize that the donation significantly enriches the teaching process.


#### RC Belgrade International: Music without Borders - Workshops for Children with Autism





## LEND YOUR VOICE, SHOW THE WORLD!" – ACCESSIBLE AUDIO BOOK STUDIOS FOR THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED ANKARA YILDIZ ROTARY CLUB

Ankara Yıldız Rotary Club brings literature to life for the visually impaired.

In an inspiring initiative under Rotary's focus area of Basic Education and Literacy, the District 2430 Ankara Yıldız Rotary Club has launched "Lend Your Voice: Accessible Audio Book Archives for the Visually Impaired."

The project established two 2.5m x 2.5m recording studios equipped with professional ventilation, light, sound insulation, acoustic panels, and computers. These compact soundproof booths offer volunteers a comfortable, accessible space to record books for the Turkish Foundation for the Blind's digital library.

Each recording is supervised by trained coordinators to ensure consistent quality and professional audio standards. By providing these facilities, Ankara Yıldız Rotary Club replaces low-quality home recordings with sustainable, publishable archives that promote inclusion and lifelong learning.

The initiative also enhances digital literacy for volunteers, who learn audio-editing and uploading skills, while visually impaired individuals gain broader access to literature and educational materials.

Special focus is given to students preparing for university entrance exams, ensuring that essential study materials are available in audio form.

The project's official opening took place on October 18, marking a proud milestone in community collaboration and accessibility.
